to develop their leaves I remembered and found this article by William Stidger.

"Luther Burbank proved that a weed is a flower, plus man. He did this with the common field daisy, which was greatly despised by farmers in the east. Mr. Burbank said to me one day that he first took an interest in that outcast weed because "every man's hand seemed to be against it."

"It is my theory that there are no outcasts in nature; everything has a use, and everything in nature is beautiful if we are eager to ennoble it. Every weed is a possible beautiful flower."

William Stidger then adds this comment: "So it is with human beings."

Have you ever thought about ennobling a weed? Have you ever thought about ennobling a human being? My understanding is that in Free Masonry one purpose is to take good men and make them better, that it, to ennoble them.

We have developed the best medical care program they can receive for their condition. For this reason, we are asking our nobility to arrange all hospital Patient Ambassador appearances through their local hospital marketing department, or in the case of our current and former National Patient Ambassadors, through the Marketing and Communications Department at Shriners International Headquarters. Please use the "Patient Ambassador Request" form to request an appearance. Click here to download the Patient Ambassador Request form.

Please do not contact our Patient Ambassadors and their families directly, even though they may have provided you with their contact information. Always contact the Marketing and Communications department at Shriners International Headquarters, or your local hospital, first so we can help you arrange their appearance.

Patient Ambassadors and their families could be going through a difficult time, they could be having some complications with their care at Shriners Hospitals for Children, or their status as a willing spokesperson has changed. Because patients receive such excellent care at Shriners Hospitals for Children, they feel obligated to attend your event when it might not be feasible for them. Patient Ambassadors and their families might have financial and other difficulties that make attending events difficult or impossible. Sometimes they are not comfortable saying "no" to an invitation to appear at your event. In other cases, some Patient Ambassadors are so popular,

they are getting invitations so frequently, attending your event might be overwhelming for them.
