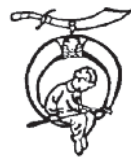
Nobles:

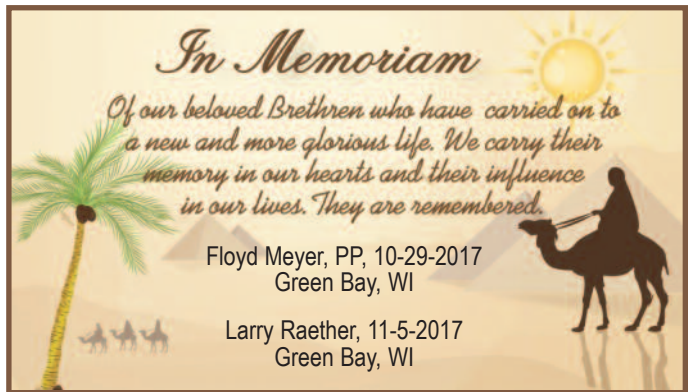
