News from Shriners Hospital Twin Cities

CORE VALUE AWARDS (Awards are given by staff members to other staff members in recognition of outstanding service) – Recently, Core Value Awards were given to the following people ---- Nate Hare – helping to make changes in the patio area that enable creation of a vegetable garden, Nilam Patel – organizing the Blood Drive, Candy Christopherson – budget saving ideas and team support in Nutrition Services, Abby Meyer – participation and support of nutrition improvement efforts, Autumn Enloe – promotion of the hospitals first edible garden and #shrinemovin initiative, and Melissa Wildy – organizing the cooking segment for social media with a great video. Each month, I am amazed at the absolutely wonderful things happening at our hospital done by our staff.

Expanded Services - couple of things coming to closure in the days ahead --- Dr. Albert Tu is adding another 1/2 clinic to see patients in a forming Spasticity Clinic (aka Rhizotomy Clinic) and Dr. Peter Karachunski, University of Minnesota Pediatric Neurologist, will be adding three halfday clinics each month, hopefully beginning in August, or no later than September. These additional clinic times will reduce the wait by our kids for these specialties. We continue to search for opportunities to increase services and patient numbers at our hospital. We need your help to accomplish this important undertaking. Help us spread the word. If you know of a child that can use our help, simply have them call 1-888-293-2832 this will get them directly to our Twin Cities hospital for evaluation and scheduling. FOCUS - One aspect of our FOCUS model of care is family centeredness --- and one dimension of family centered care is the look and feel of the building when families arrive seeking medical care, in what can be so to advance a coordinated stressful circumstances. effort to improve our appearance, we created the FACE Committee (Functional, Appearance, Campus. Environment) to guide our priorities and allocate The intent here is to have an ongoing, resources. consistent effort that keeps advancing our mission to be safe, welcoming and effective in our service. Recent actions driven by this workgroup include - Updating signs and wayfinding within the building, Washing the wallpapered walls in the common spaces, Cleaning up trees and maintaining plantings around the building, Improved appearance of the Nebraska room, Eliminating handwritten, temporary signs by creating a way to post short-term information in displays, Repainting the Midwest room - with current work on the Cafeteria, Sharing quick, easy improvements with Department heads in major traffic areas on aesthetic upgrades. Future actions include; Purchase of waiting area chairs in the clinic waiting area, Design of a new registration/scheduling desk area, Display of more artwork that centers on TWI patients in action. I mention these projects because they are centered on several guiding principles 1) focus on high traffic, public areas first, 2) Live within our financial means (so much of this work is done internally and/or supported by donors) and 3) maintain a consistency to the decorating. The baseline for design and planning is the newly renovated clinic. We hope to extend the wall colors, flooring and general style of that space to the entire building.

Finally, I think it is important for you to understand what the parents of our kids have to say. Our Twin Cities hospital continually receives high ratings for the service we provide. Here are just a few comments from our June report; I have never been in a hospital like the Twin Cities, Everyone who works there was super nice and genuine. We left feeling like part of a family that would miss us as much as we will miss them. I cannot wait to go back for the 3 months check up to see everyone! Can I give a 10?, Everyone smiled, helped the second you needed anything, and treated you like their favorite family member. The nurses came in all times throughout the day and night to check on my child. I could honestly say every one of them was amazing! and I will absolutely recommend Shriners to others. Everything was excellent from the second we walked in the door. It was by far our best medical experience, ever! Everything from registration, x-rays, to the wealth of knowledge by Dr. Vara. These kinds of comments must make you proud of your hospital and staff.

News from Shriners Hospital Chicago

In 1995 the Ronald McDonald House in Maywood, IL – next to the Loyola Hospital Campus – opened its doors. The Mission of Ronald McDonald House Charities (RMHC) is, "To care for families of children with complex medical needs by providing comfort, compassion and a sense of community. RMHC-CNI keeps families of hospitalized children together in a 'home away from home'." They do just that by offering families who are in town for medical care a comfortable, inviting place to stay. The Maywood House boasts 18 bedrooms and has a décor theme based on the children's book The Secret Garden.

The Chicago Shriners Hospital transportation coordinators work closely with the Maywood RMHC, ensuring that SHC outpatients who need housing for one or more nights are set-up with a room. Shriners' patient families usually fill more than 50% of beds at the Maywood campus. Housing is provided at a \$10 donation per night. Families have access to a large kitchen and refrigerators for meal prep and food storage, as well as an outside grill. Several indoor and outdoor play areas, TVs, a library, and lounges are available for recreation.

The Maywood campus is a 20-minute drive to the Chicago Shriners Hospital, and both SHC and RMHC work with Blue Cab to arrange rides for families.

"Families appreciate the sense of community they feel here, and that everything is done for them. It's very helpful on their medical journey," says House Director Kelly Evans. The Chicago Shriners Hospital is pleased to work with such a fantastic organization.


