


Hello Ladies of Beja, Summer is almost over. Where did the time go?

News from Shriners Hospital *Twin Cities*

It's summer and it's busy at your Twin Cities Hospital. Patient Volumes – Status report on our YTD thru July numbers – a lot of good trends in the right direction; Outpatient Encounters – Up 2.7%, Intakes Received (referrals) – up 20%, Intakes Accepted – up 11%, Patient Days – up 6%, Discharges --- down 2, Total Surgery – down 37 cases, Lab – Up 3%, Radiology – Up 5%, Rehab (OT & PT combined) – Up 13%, POPS (Prosthetics and Orthotics all devices) – Up 12% (increase from central fabrication). Year to Date Patient Satisfaction (percent ranking against other pediatric hospitals) – Remember FOCUSED – we are family centered and here is good evidence of that attention Inpatient --- 99th percentile – top of class, Outpatient Clinic – 92nd percentile --- nearly top of class, Outpatient Surgery – 99th percentile – top of class. As a hospital system, we are measured both within the Shrine Hospital system as well as with other pediatric hospitals. Each year we are given many goals to achieve. The above listing is just a few measurements to provide you on the current successes of our Twin Cities hospital. As always, more patients would be valuable to the overall success of the hospital.

I had the fantastic opportunity to attend the 2017 Imperial session in Daytona Beach. The session is a working meeting of the two corporations of our fraternity. The Shriners Hospitals for Children, a Colorado corporation and Shriners International the fraternity, an Iowa corporation. The thing that I was so impressed with is the work of our staffs in making both organizations top notch. This is evident by the 4-star rating given our hospital system by Charity Navigator. This is a tool used by individuals and corporations in determining the overall success of a charity and helps guide them in making donation decisions. We talk so often about our 22 hospitals, but we forget the other work we do. Research, education, off site clinical work and last year on three occasions the dispatch of medical teams to serious accidents involving children. Two of these involved serious fires and burn injuries and one involved injuries from a bomb blast. These efforts have made us visible throughout the world and something we should all be very proud of. During the sessions, many videos were shared with the wonderful work being done at your Twin Cities hospital. As a board member, I was extremely proud to see examples of what are staff is doing every day shared with all of the Nobility at the session.

Finally, I think it is important for you to understand what the parents of our kids have to say. Our Twin Cities hospital continually receives high ratings for the service we provide. Here are just a few comments from our July report; Everyone is amazing! Nursing care: Just awesome! Heidi, Dani and Liz, Discharge: Nurse Dani was excellent in explaining everything, Your child's physician: Absolutely awesome! Dr. Mielke has excellent bedside manner, very comfortable to be around., I could write excellent on

comment and wouldn't be good enough. God bless you all! The best thing is now our son's quality of walking & his hips and back not hurting in the future -- are improving. Our local doctor recommended Dr. Mielke; we are grateful. Out of three different health care facilities we use, Shriners is the best. Best staff courtesy, best waiting area, best check in process, best convenience of other depts close by in clinic area, best parking. Do not change a thing!! I share these comments with you as I want you to know what our parents think about our hospital and staff. Everyday lives are changed because of the work they do. Remember your efforts in supporting this work, makes it happen.

If you have any questions about your Twin Cities Hospital, please give me a call. My responsibility as a board member is to keep you informed. Thank you for providing me with this wonderful opportunity.

Imperial Potentate's Membership Referral Program introduced

Imperial Potentate's Membership Referral Program introduced During his Pageant at Imperial Session 2017, Imperial Sir Gary Bergenske announced a call to action – asking ALL Shriners to take a stand against the declining membership in our fraternity, referring friends, family members and coworkers for further contact, education and information about Shriners International and Freemasonry.

Imperial Sir Bergenske set a lofty goal of 12,000 new creations across all of Shrinedom between Imperial Session 2017 & Imperial Session 2018. Now the work begins! Are YOU committed to membership?

With this new referral functionality, current nobles can directly refer the names of friends, family members and acquaintances who they feel would make good Shriners.

The new referral program is similar to beashrinernow.com, but is administered through WebFez and directly links the prospect with his referring noble. This promotes natural mentorship based on a pre-existing friendship or acquaintance. Progress can be tracked and reported, and the submission of a referral triggers automatic communications to the referrer and the prospect, which are built into the process. Once a noble makes a referral, he then receives tools and resources to adequately mentor his prospect to creation or restoration.

The program encourages constant collaboration, so that everyone can share their Shrine with the good men within their communities.

In rolling out this program, Shriners International is excited to announce the recognition and rewards offered to local Nobles who are responsible for referring and top-line-signing new nobles during the 2017-2018 Imperial Year. Each month and quarterly, from August 2017 through June 2018, the noble who top-line signs the most number of new creations during that period will receive cash prizes (\$100 monthly; \$500 quarterly) as well as certain other recognitions.

Note: These rewards will be given to nobles for top-line signing the most newly created nobles throughout the Imperial Year.

At the close of this program, the noble signing the most new petitions for new nobles who have been created, as well as the temple creating the most new nobles (membership gain by percentage), will each receive a \$1,000 cash prize and be recognized at Imperial Session 2018.
