The Beja Divan has recently adopted Beja Policy #17, Social Media. The policy will be found on our website and linked in the eBugler in the near future. It will also be published in the next printed Bugler.

A few points to remember...

When we don the red Fez of a Shriner, we are symbolically tying around our waist the white lambskin apron of a Master Mason. We heard these words when we became Shriners and we must remember this when posting on social media. As a rule of thumb, never resort to name calling or posting something you wouldn't say in front of your mother, wife or daughter.

Our words and actions in public generate the public's impression of Shriners and Masons. We want to ensure that the image portrayed is the right image and does not bring discredit upon either body.

Shrine Masons must conduct their social media activities in a way that reflects membership in the fraternity, acting in a way that presents a positive image; avoiding private piques and quarrels; being cautious in behavior; courteous to our Brethren and to promote the general good and to preserve the reputation of the fraternity.

Shrine Masons must be aware that postings are a permanent record; and therefore, an individual's conduct may influence the world with a positive or negative image about the individual and also about Shriners and Freemasonry. Postings and actions on the various social media outlets should reflect the highest standards of morality and integrity.

Postings should not bring discredit to Shriners International, Shriners Hospitals for Children®, or Freemasonry nor should they fit within the definition of conduct unbecoming. Conduct contrary to the accepted and customary rule of right and duty between Shriners and Freemasons or to society in general, is improper.

Two very important things are currently required:


- 1. please purchase your Noble tickets

A biographical sketch of Myron E. Christensen BEJA SPRING CEREMONIAL 2020

I was born May 21st,1931 at Marshfield, WI. I am the first of three children born to Oscar and Gertrude Christensen. In these first months I acquired the nickname which is still use, "Myke" (the spelling is my choice). I grew up on a farm in the Cary Bluff area, south of Marshfield until I was jusy over 9 years old. Then my family moved to Beloit, WI.

I graduated from the Beloit Senior High School in 1949, where I met the love of my life Ruthann. In August of 1949 I enlisted in the United States Navy, serving for three years. The Korean War added nine months to that tour of duty. I worked as an electronic technician in the Navy.

Honorably discharged from the Navy in May of 1953 I returned home to marry Ruthann Kelley (from Edgerton, WI,) on May 31st, 1953. Ruthann and I have three sons and one daughter; seven grandsons and one granddaughter; six great granddaughters and four great grandsons.

I attended college at Milton College, Milton, WI. In September of 1953. I graduated from Milton College in May of 1957 with a Bachelor of Science, Cum Laude, degree. During the first three years of college I worked the second shift at the Fischer Body Plant in Janesville (making Chevrolet bodies) while carrying a full course of load at school. In my senior year I began (July 1956) serving two churches, the La Grange and Adams Methodist Churches in the East Wisconsin Conference.

I continued to serve churches as a student pastor as I finished college and went through my seminary training at Garrett-Evangelical Theological Seminary in Evanston, IL. I entered Garrett (today referred to a GETS) in the fall of 1957 and graduated in 1963 with a Master of Divinity degree.

In the years of serving churches as an ordained pastor, I served 10 different appointments, five of them had two churches (total churches served was 15). I retired July 1,1996. In my 24th year of retirement I am in my 12th year of working with the Methodist Church in Mattoon, a small congregation that wants to stay open.

- Initiated in Clintonville Lodge 3/8/71 (Masons in the Marion church "encouraged" me to join.)
- Passed 4/14/72, Raised 9/25/72
- · Joined York Rite 1999, Initiated in Beja 1999
- In 2004 PP Dennis Korth appointed me Chaplain to finish out the term of John Lyford (October Decem ber), Bill Wenszell appointed me Chaplain for 2005. I have been Chaplain ever since
- Joined Scottish Rite 2002 I became a member of Inter City Shrine Club, Member of the Krazy Kops, Member of Shawano Shrine Club
- Grand Chaplain of Royal and Select Master 2001-2002 and have been the Grand Chaplain of Royal and Select Master at least 6 times
- Ruthann and I joined Eastern Star 9/18/73

I have been active in lodges in those communities where Masons were active in the church and in the lodge. There never were scheduled meetings causing conflict between the church and the lodge in those communities.



News from Shriners Hospital Chicago

Shriners Hospitals for Children

To all Nobles, Ladies of the Shrine and all Beja friends. I am writing this while sitting in my living room watching the Super Bowl and thinking they are missing the Packers.

Here are some interesting stats and information from your Chicago Hospital:

We have hired a new Orthopedic Surgeon to build up the team.

Terri Aiello has been hired as the new Director of Patient Care Services/Nurse Executive. Ms. Aiello has been with SHC-Chicago for many years and has been very instrumental in our continued growth and progress.

Last year our physician liaisons had 1,329 face-to-face visits with pediatric medical staffs in the local area to let them know what we do at SHC-Chicago. This is a great way to get our name out in the medical community and tell them what we can do to augment their pediatric program. And it is working, we are getting new patient referrals as a result of this program.

Currently there are 142 pending requests for international care from 50 countries. We are working with Headquarters to provide care to these requests.

We had 555 new admissions last year.

Everyone should have an elevator speech ready to talk about our healthcare system. SHC now prefers to place the emphasis on "we have treated over 1.4 million kids", rather on how many 'hospitals' we have.

Hospital Day at SHC-Chicago is Sunday, June 7, 2020. The program will begin at noon, tours will be offered prior to the program. Let's make this a big day with many Beja Shriners and Ladies in attendance.


