

Shriners Hospitals for Children to potentially cut inpatient care services at sole Minnesota facility

Shriners Hospitals for Children-Twin Cities in Minneapolis is reportedly considering ending inpatient services at the facility, Fox 9 News reports.

A spokesperson for the hospital, which treats roughly 6,500 patients annually, told Fox 9 News Shriners is "evaluating alternative options for inpatient care, [but] the details or dates of any service change are not yet determined."

The spokesperson told the publication one of the "alternative options" under consideration is ending inpatient services altogether. It is unclear how the service changes would affect the hospital's estimated 150 employees.

Shriners Hospitals for Children-Twin Cities told Becker's Hospital Review in a statement Feb. 9, "Shriners Hospitals for Children-Twin Cities is evaluating alternative options for inpatient care. This effort is in recognition of the nationwide trend to more outpatient-oriented services while the need for overnight [inpatient] care declines. The details or dates of any service change are not yet determined." Re-printed from Becker's Hospital Review

News from Shriners Hospital Twin Cities

I wanted to take this opportunity to update you on the status of your Twin Cities Hospital. You may have heard that the Imperial/Hospital Joint Boards are evaluating the service model at the Twin Cities Hospital. I will share that the local Board of Governors is working with the joint boards to develop a workable and successful care model for the future of your Twin Cities Hospital. The underlining theme is to treat more kids, in more places, for less costs. At the Midwest Shrine Association meeting, Nobles were informed of the high per patient cost for care at the Twin Cities Hospital. We were also told that do to the low number of in-patient nights, we may not continue to qualify as a hospital. At this point no specific changes have been made. The work is continuing to develop partnerships that will increase our numbers while looking at the use of Telehealth, out patient clinics and remote sites to add to our numbers. Additionally, we may see some of our patients taken to other Shriners Hospitals for their in-patient surgeries as we continue to perform out patient and clinic services in the Twin Cities area. We are not the only hospital being evaluated.

A recent communication from our Imperial Potentate identified that the joint boards are evaluating the consolidation of our four burn hospitals into two locations. As the work across our health care system continues to address treating more kids, in more places, for less money, please be assured that I will continue to update you as information becomes available. The bottom line is to do what's right for our kids.

NASCAR DRIVER DAVID RAGAN WEARS A DIFFERENT KIND OF HAT Visit to Shriners Children's Hospital was life-changing

David Ragan recalls his first visit to a Shriners Children's Hospital in his rookie NASCAR season of 2007. He was just 21, but already was looking for a children's-related charity to support. A Shriner he met on a race weekend talked him into seeing what the Tampa hospital was doing for children with burns and orthopedic issues.

That visit touched his heart and changed his life.

"I saw kids with prosthetic limbs and issues with their hands and fingers and with walking, I thought (the hospital's treatment) was a neat thing that improved those kids' lives," he said Friday at Daytona International Speedway. "I decided I wanted to help, and the best way was to raise money and awareness. I became a member of the (Shriners) fraternity so I could use my NASCAR platform to tell people about what the hospitals do.

"There are many good hospitals that do great for so many children. There's the Children's Miracle Network and the Ronald McDonald House and the Levine Children's Cancer Hospital in Charlotte. To me, though, the Shriners haven't always gotten the recognition they deserve. They're an outstanding charity, and almost all their money goes to running those hospitals. They're very conservative, but do a great job for those kids."

The Shriners -- you know, the guys with fez caps, silly little parade cars and raucous parties -- support 22 hospitals in 16 states, plus facilities in Canada and Mexico. Its staffs specialize in orthopedic care and burns, but also deal with myriad children's facial and cranial issues. Mostly, they concentrate on children born without a limb or with spinal cord injuries or walking problems. The treatment is available regardless of a patient's ability to pay, thus freeing them from medical debt.

"The Shriners can do that because they raise money for their hospitals," said Ragan. "We have about 250,000 members. I went through the three degrees of Freemasonry to become a Shriner so I could support the hospitals. I've raised maybe \$600,000 to \$700,000 in the last eight or nine years by auctioning off my drivers' uniforms and auctioning some of my race cars."

"We bring some of the (hospitals') donors to races to entertain them and let them have fun. The biggest thing -- and it's not really something you can track -- is how it makes the patients feel. Last year, at Michigan, we brought a young doubleamputee to the track as our guest. It was priceless to see him have fun and be like a normal kid again. You just couldn't put a value on that experience. We bring kids to six or seven races each year and let them have fun. Whether they're a burn victim or have a prosthetic, we let them have fun."



As the newly elected Oriental Guide, I have been tasked with several duties for Beja Shrine. We have 13 Clubs or Units, so I will only ask that those two representatives be there to do that for one meeting in the year. With that being said, you will be assigned to take that Club/Unit turn. If they have already done their duty. I will find another way that your club/unit can help us out.

Your representatives need to be at Beja Shrine, 60 minutes prior to dinner. A list of Nobles that will be attending will be provided for you, and I will have the cash drawer ready to go.
