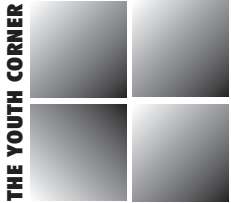
Nominate A Great Shriner Today

In May there are two important dates to remember:

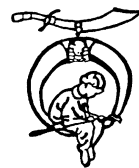

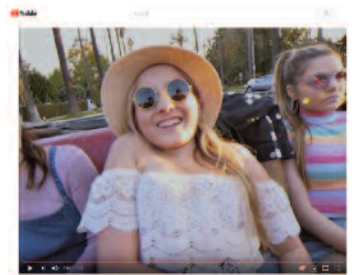


Roll This Way Video

What I learned at AR School

On Wednesday, March 13th, during the Shrine Law Seminar put on by John Hanson, I received a surprise that sent my heart racing.

In the middle of Hanson discussing the impacts of Article 30 (how Imperial can remove a person from the Fraternity) Imperial Sir Bill Bailey pulled me aside and said some people needed to talk to me in 30 minutes.

For the next 28 minutes I pondered everything I did wrong during the Assistant Rabban seminar. Sure, I butchered my karaoke song the previous night, and I'll be the first to admit, the Midwest Shrine Association did consume a few adult beverages over the course of the event.

But why in the world was I being pulled aside, taken to the hallway and having a talking to, just mere hours before we had to catch a plane?

It turns out my connections to El Zagal have served me well. Of the 196 Temples in North America, I was selected to go on camera and talk about the AR school experience in a video that will be sent to the entire Nobility. At least they weren't pulling my Fez.

The biggest thing I mentioned on film was the changing of mindsets that we all need to have. At AR school we learned about the difference between an inward and outward mindset.

Let's say we know a Noble who for whatever reason isn't becoming involved in events. An inward mindset would be to assume that the Noble doesn't care, thinks little of the Fraternity, or finds other Shriners to be annoying.

But from an outward mindset, things we wouldn't necessarily think of come to mind. Maybe this Noble is having a hard time financially, and needs to pick up extra hours at his job. Maybe one of his kids are sick. Maybe he is having a tough time just getting out of bed in the morning.

It's by shifting our initial thought process that we can begin to see a litany of other factors, that while not producing the outcome we desire, help us understand each other better, which is more valuable. From there we can begin the process of not only better understanding each other, but also being there to support each other.

If we are to grow locally, we need to be there for our members, even when times are tough. I saw that kindness in all of our hearts as Shriners and Masons, at AR school in action and this didn't come in a seminar.

The AR from Kerak Shrine in Reno, Nevada, Mike, was late to the party.

He only found out about the event a few weeks earlier and thus couldn't secure the discounted rate at the host hotel. Mike stayed at a nearby motel where the conditions were less than hospitable. All I will say is that Mike really wished he had his concealed carry on him. Hearing his plight, Joe, my counterpart from Tripoli, welcomed him to the extra bed in his room.

While our main philanthropy as Shriners is our Hospital system, this was a wonderful reminder that we have to look out for each other first.

Mike became an honorary MSA counterpart that night because of the kindness of Joe. Seeing that reaffirmed my commitment to who we are as Shriners and Masons.

Finally, I learned at AR school are that we need to diversify our fundraising. When my group was asked how many Temples still use the Circus as the main fundraiser, about half the hands went up. Indeed, many Temples have already abandoned the Circus.

It's not to say that I don't appreciate the show and all the work we as Nobles and Ladies do to make it a success, but the time will come when we need to think outside of the box. Doing this proactively instead of reactively will better position the future of Beja.

Our current Chief Rabban and President of the Shrine Fundraising Association, Jim VanDeHey, helped with probably the most engaging seminar I attended. As a Temple we need to be willing to listen to Jim and some of his ideas, because he is a great resource and we are lucky to have him. One of his ideas I already support, but we will let Jim present that at a later date.

News From YOUR Hospitals.

Our name has changed, but that's just the beginning. Below are some bullet points to keep you updated on your Shriners Healthcare for Children – Twin Cities.

- Our mission hasn't changed --- we treating the same number of kids, but we are using partner services for hospital related care (surgery and inpatient care).
- We are operating as a clinic and the feedback from our patient families has been very positive re: the care they receive here and the care provided by Gillette, our hospital partner.
- We continue to provide the same level of financial support for families even when services are needed outside our building --- but, the process for getting that support has changed and we do require more engagement from families to work through the steps leading to Shriners financial support.
- WGA4Kids and the Women's Auxiliaries are an extremely vital and an invaluable resource in helping us fund wheel chairs and support for our kids during their visits – and this will continue.
- We are actively seeking a new location in the metro Twin Cities area. We expect to find a site and move by early 2020 into a building designed for the next generation of healthcare (outpatient oriented)
- Our current building is for sale – Colliers International is managing the sale of the Twin Cities location and the now vacant Lexington KY hospital.
- We are concurrently developing outreach sites across the region. Telehealth, on-site clinics, POPS clinics and other Shrine services will be offered at various sites including Omaha area, Rapid City, Bismarck, Sioux Falls, Des Moines and others.

The technology has advanced such that these services are now possible.

We are the vanguard for changes that are occurring across the Shrine system --- a recent Future Vision presentation is being shared by Joint Board members at various association meetings. It suggests that we need to reform in a way that perpetuates the mission, enabling us to treat more kids, in more locations, at less cost. I just described the direction of our Twin Cities site to advance this plan.

Other elements of the Shriners Hospital Systems 2035 strategic plan include:

- Development of 1-4 Centers of Excellence Hospitals across the country --- and a reduction of other hospital sites. Centers of Excellence will provide ALL services, including Pediatric ICU, MRI, EOS, surgical care, in patient, out patient, rehab and prosthetics for all 4 of our main treatment areas, Orthopedics, Cleft Lip and Palate, Burns and Spinal Cord Injuries.
- Creating a wide range of access points – smaller clinics or telehealth sites that make patient access easier and less costly.
- Expansion internationally with emphasis on training the next generation of doctors in those foreign countries to provide direct care.
- Being more nimble and bold --- which will require changes to our governance and decision making structure.

These are exciting times for both the SHC-Twin Cities and the entire Shriners Hospital system. If you have any questions, please feel free to contact me.

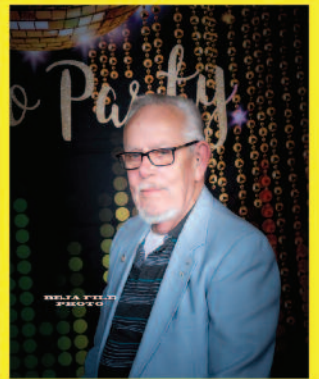
