THE CHAPLAIN'S CORNER



The Psalmist wrote,
"I praise you, for I am fearfully and wonderfully made."
(Psalm 139:14, NRSV)

These words of the Psalmist have become words of inspiration and affirmation for Jeff Steinberg.

He shared his story in a daily devotional called "the Upper Room."

"Since I was born with no arms and two badly bent legs, you might not think that I am. But I am 'fearfully and wonderfully made.' Often when my wife and I go out, people act shocked to see a short man whose one artificial arm has a hook attached to it. They cannot get past my appearance to see me. But I have come to realize that it is not my outward form that makes me wonderful.

My parents were unable to care for me, but my heavenly Father was always directing and guiding me as I was moved from place to place. At the Shriners Hospital, I was fitted for my first arm and had many surgeries that enable me to walk. Just down the street from the Good Shepherd Home, my last group home, was a storefront Mennonite Church, whose Sunday School teachers came week after week to take me and other children to church. They made me part of their lives and loved me. Together with one of my nurses, they taught me that I, Jeff Steinberg – born with no arms and a twisted leg – am fearfully and wonderfully made."

He goes on to point out how what many call "handicaps" have become a springboard for him to share his faith in God's love. I like his reference to the Shriners Hospital. It helps me point out that as Shriners we are in the business of helping children with challenging conditions know and understand that they are "fearfully and wonderfully made."

Modern conditions have caused us Shriners to state in new ways who we are, the medical care we offer and where we offer it. All these changes have not altered the fact that when children come to the Shrine they find love, and they learn they are fearfully and wonderfully made, and we continue to be Love to the Rescue.

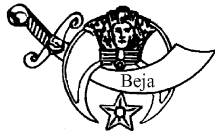

Chicago Hospital Spotlight!

Nerve Transfer Surgeries Offer New Hope for Children

Among the first in the area to offer the treatment for acute flaccid myelitis.

Max is a big fan of fishing. Last summer the 7-year-old spent many days going fishing with his neighbor. His family hopes he can fish again after a rare sudden illness left him unable to move one arm and temporarily paralyzed his legs. Acute flaccid myelitis (AFM) is a condition that can attack the nervous tissue and the myelin (the protective coating) of the spine nerves. Doctors at Shriners Hospitals for Children — Chicago took some of Max's own nerves from his rib cage area and transferred them to his right arm. It is hoped the nerve transfer surgery will restore better movement to his right elbow and hand. Shriners Hospital is among the first to offer this technique in Chicago for patients with AFM. "After a period of recovery, we take an inventory of nerve function using a combination of physical examination and nerve testing to see what's working, what the patient has that wasn't affected by AFM, or that has recovered sufficiently and can be used to augment what isn't working," said Felicity Fishman, M.D., an orthopaedic hand and upper extremity surgeon at the Chicago Shriners Hospital. "It takes at least six months or longer to start to see if nerve transfers were successful because nerves regenerate slowly, about an inch a month."

Shriners Hospitals takes a team approach to children with AFM. Two orthopaedic hand surgeons, Dr. Fishman, and Sameer Puri, M.D., work together in the operating room. A physiatrist and pediatric rehabilitation team provide support with medications and therapy, which Dr. Fishman says are an essential component of a successful result. After taking a month to heal from surgery, Max has had regular occupational and physical therapy all summer to keep his muscles and joints flexible. His family is still waiting to see if the nerve transfer will allow him to fish or write using his right hand again. "It's waiting and working and that will be the hardest part now for a whole year," Max's mom, Anna, said. She has already noticed small changes. "How he keeps his hand down. Before it was turned under and bent. Now his hand is more loose and straight. I'm so glad we came here."

Why We Don't Use the Term 'Free' When Describing Care at Shriners Hospitals for Children

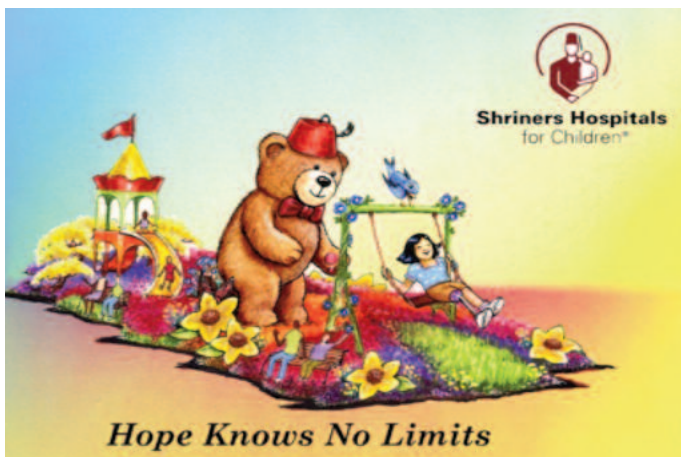
'All care and services are provided regardless of the families' ability to pay' is the correct phrase to use when describing the cost of care. Do not use free, at no cost, at no charge, or without financial obligation. This statement is taken from the 'Shriners Hospitals for Children Identity Standards and Guidelines' which can be found on Shriners Village under the 'Resources' tab.

"Regardless of the ability to pay" is not just because of insurance agreements, it is, in fact, a legal requirement. Because Shriners Hospitals for Children relies on Medicaid/Medicare, it is forbidden to use the word free. Please refer to the Medicare Inducement/Enticement Law. A medical facility cannot use the word "free" because it constitutes "enticing" a referral. So, by law, we are only allowed to say regardless of ability to pay. I hope this information helps everyone.

This topic comes up every year in discussions at the marketing conference in Tampa. It is also discussed with the Nobles who attend the marketing conferences. With thousands upon thousands of Shriners across the US and the world, the message often doesn't reach everyone. If you ever have questions, feel free to contact me for clarification.

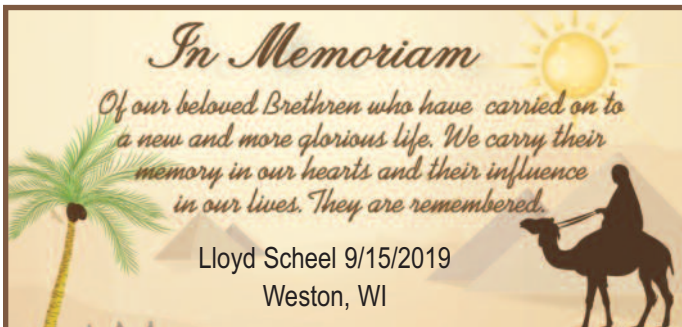

LEADERSHIP CONFERENCE OF SHRINERS HOSPITALS FOR CHILDREN

INTER-CITY SHRINE CLUB President - Eugene "Gene" Reece

Dear fellow Nobles,

At the January 2019 Leadership Conference of Shriners Hospitals for Children, a high-level vision for the hospital system in 2035 began to emerge. It was decided that quality would govern all care decisions, delivery of care models would be evaluated in all facilities, and new methods of reaching more kids in more places would be fully investigated. As healthcare has undergone incredible changes, so too must Shriners Hospitals for Children.

The vision of establishing 1-4 Centers of Excellence was established along with a goal of 200+ access points to Shriners care throughout the United States. Since that time, many changes have taken place within our system. Twin Cities, Tampa, Boston, and Cincinnati are all reimagining their delivery of care and transforming to better serve the pediatric specialty needs of our patients in the future.

With quality as the primary driver for all future decisions, criteria were established for evaluating potential Centers of Excellence throughout the United States. Many steps, including short term and intermediate transitions will be necessary to arrive at that goal of establishing these premier pediatric care facilities. Since our Imperial Session in July, Houston and Galveston, utilizing a newly established governance model, along with the Joint Boards voted to merge their facilities into one by late 2020.

Most recently, the Joint Boards have approved the Beta Center of Excellence Business Plan for SHC — Northern California. This decision begins the process of necessary investment and changes needed to begin the journey of potentially becoming a Center of Excellence.

All of these decisions reflect system wide opportunities, and regardless of geography, should be viewed as system initiatives that benefit the continuation of our incredible mission at Shriners Hospitals for Children. As we journey toward our next 100 years, working together we can take our system beyond where it has ever been before as we re-reshape and transform pediatric specialty care for future generations.
