The sundial that stands outside Union Station by Alameda Street in Los Angeles has an inscription that reads "Vision to see, Faith to believe, Courage to do."

In 1870 some Master Mason had a vision that masonry needed a fraternity that stressed fun and fellowship and would give a place for brotherly to be expressed in social settings. They had the faith to believe and the courage to bring about such a fraternity, Shriners International.

Then in 1919 a Potentate-elect had the vision for a charity that would "belong" to the Shrine. After a year of study, the outline of the medical program developed. It would offer, at no expense to the family, the highest quality care to children with pediatric orthopedic conditions, burn injuries, and other special needs.

Those early Shriners went for the Vision, had the Faith to believe, and the Courage to do, and the Shriners Hospitals for Children was established.

In 1922 the first hospital was opened. Since then 21 more hospitals have been opened and additional health conditions/needs added to the "we do" list.

We are living in times of great change in how we do things in living our lives. There great changes include how we give and receive medical care. (I have lived long enough to witness and to know the need to participate in some of them.)

The Supreme Architect of the Universe has raised up from within our Shrine members, leaders with new Visions of how we can continue to offer our outstanding health care. We are beginning to hear about the new Visions. We are being called on to have the Faith to believe, and Courage to do, because the children are still in need.

There are still children who will look to Shriners for help because they know the Nobles and Ladies of the Shrine Love to the Rescue.

Greetings from your Chicago Hospital Rep.

First and foremost, the Chicago Board of Governors approved the application of Gary Fehl to be a voting member of the Board beginning this coming January. What that means is little Beja will have two voting members at the Chicago Hospital (only Medinah has more than one voting member). Please congratulate Gary and wish him continued success.

Our Hospital numbers are down from last year because of summer schedules, vacations, etc. and will continue to be monitored.

- New exams scheduled at your Chicago hospital were 162 in June 2019 as compared to 198 in the previous year.
- Inpatient surgical procedures totaled 43 in June 2019 as compared to 60 in June 2018.
- Outpatient surgeries in June 2019 totaled 72 as compared to 78 for June 2018.

Spine surgeries remain constant at 10.

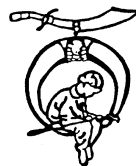

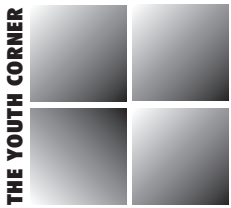

Membership Recruitment Awards Program

I would like to take this opportunity to remind all Nobles and their Ladies of the Imperial "Just One" program. The concept is if every Beja active Noble brought in just one new or restored member, we would position Beja for Success. Now is the time to get those new petitions in for our coming fall ceremonial on Saturday October 26th at the Beja Shrine Center. Below is an explanation of our Beja membership award program. Won't you consider earning your SAMSAR award or moving to the next Samsar Level.

Membership Recruitment Awards Program

1. General Provisions

a. For the success of Beja Temple, an active membership recruiting team is an essential component of the membership program. To promote and recognize success of membership recruitment, Beja Temple has established a membership recruitment awards program called the Beja SAMSAR award.

b. SAMSAR points are awarded to the top line and second line signer on a new Shriner Petition. The top line signer receiving two (2) points and the second line signer receiving one (1) point.

c. SAMSAR points are awarded to the top line signer on the petition for an affiliation, association or re-instatement. The top line signer receives one (1) point.

2. SAMSAR Jewel Award Criteria

- a. SAMSAR Jewel.....6 points
- b. Red Crescent.....12 points
- c. Yellow Crescent.....18 Points
- d. Emerald Star.....24 points

3. Membership Award Program Reciprocity

a. Membership is a fraternal success not just a Temple success. To promote this success, any Beja member who has earned membership award points from another Temple, may submit those points along with a point award explanation to the Divan for review. Points earned from another Temple will be re-calculated into the Beja program with the appropriate Beja SAMSAR points being awarded.

Shriners Healthcare for Children *TWIN CITIES*

Over the last few years I have spoken about the camps we host at Shriners Healthcare for Children- Twin Cities. Here is a report from our Maureen Johnson, Child Life regarding our last camp for 2019, please enjoy.

And that's a wrap on July! It was a month filled with lots of action in the clinic and off-site! From July 22-25, we had 26 campers for Camp Achieve 9 -13 years old. This year's camp set a record for the largest number of kids, with campers traveling from as far away as Texas, South Dakota, and Nebraska. One reason is so they can hang out and do fun things with their friends and not have a worry about being different and feeling like they are being judged. According to a few parents who have kids nearing the 13-year mark, their child has already expressed sadness about not being able to have a reason to be a part of this camp.

I always ask the kids for their input to make the camps fun and exciting every year; it amazes me that they always say they want to repeat exactly what we have done in the past. They say over and over it really is just about being together. This year we started the week off on a high note — zip lining and a high ropes course. For many, it was a first-time experience. For at least one, it was a TERRIFYING experience. To watch the group of kids, cheer an anxious camper on made my heart swell. Not a single hurry up, don't be a chicken, scaredy cat. He was on deck for at least 10 minutes talking himself into going and talking it out with everyone else. All he got were cheers, positive affirmations and you can do this! The day flew by and when we got on the bus at the end of it all they were all hot, sweaty and full of pride and excitement on what they had done.

On Tuesday, we headed out to Lake Minnetonka for a morning boat cruise. When I was pulling out the camera, a camper asked if they could take photos, then another one asked, and before I knew it I had a lineup of wannabe photographers. I told them they were in charge of getting photos that captured the boat ride experience and that I did not want to see any body parts when I downloaded them. They were in charge of making a list of who wanted to be on the photographer list and pass it on whenever they decided on what the time limit would be. I never heard another word. they did a great job working it out and taking the photos. After the boat ride, we headed to the Zuhrah Horse barn for an afternoon of riding horses and visiting with the volunteers.
