They have provided millions of dollars towards wheelchairs and other adaptive mobility equipment. They support our kids directly by providing toys, games, blankets, mittens and hats just to name a few of the items they provide.

They also provide staff support when ever asked. One very important initiative is their holiday gift bag program. All Shriners patients and their siblings who visit the clinic in the month of December receives a gift bag full of toys, games and puzzles. 

BASICS

- *Time and Place* Feztival of Trees will be held from Wednesday 11/26 Sunday 11/30, closed on Thursday 11/27 Thanksgiving Day
- Application Deadline All applications must be submitted or staff notified by October 1, 2025
- Set up time The set-up time for a sponsor to set up their tree is Sunday 11/23 10-7pm or Monday 10am-4pm.
- Sponsorship Night Tuesday,11/25 7-10pm. Sponsors will be provided five (5) tickets to this special Event with 5 drink tickets and assorted appetizers. Raffle ticket purchases will be available.
- Liability Beja Shriners, Beja Shrine Center, Shriners International and Shriners Hospitals for Children are not responsible for any loss or damage to any sponsored owned or furnished items during the event. Not liable for any accidents or bodily injury that may occur on the event premises.

TREE SPECIFICATIONS

- Tree spaces are 6 foot by 6 foot (all trees, gifts and related items must fit in the assigned area)
- Trees must be a minimum of four (4) feet unless pre-approved by the Feztival of Trees staff.
- Trees must be artificial
- Trees must have LED lighting ONLY
- Sponsors are asked to choose a theme for their tree decorations that are appropriate for the public and represents their business, organization or family. *Beja Feztival of Trees* reserves the right to not allow any tree deemed inappropriate.
- Creative and non-traditional trees are welcome if they follow the tree rules.
- Each tree will be provided with one electrical outlet to use. Sponsors must use the assigned electrical outlet. Feztival of Trees staff will be available to assist with electrical connections.
- Sponsors should provide one (1) extension cord with UL or ETL listed. It is recommended that the cord be 15-20 feet long. The cord will be given away with the tree.
- Empty tree boxes and other reusable packaging will be held by the *Feztival of Trees staff* and provided to the tree winner

PRIZES

Message From the Beja Recorder Desk

Beja Divan will be presenting the following language as a proposed Beja bylaws change to Article 7 Committees.

The language further identifies the requirements of the Leadership Search Committee.

The language will be brought up for action at the April stated meeting and held for action at the September stated meeting.

All members are encouraged to attend both the April and September meetings to participate in the discussion on this bylaw change.

Proposed Amendment to the Bylaws of Beja Shriners

Current Bylaws Language (Article VII, Paragraph 7.1): "The Board of Directors shall appoint a Leadership Search Committee as allowed by the provisions of the bylaws of Shriners International."

Proposed Amendment:

To amend Article VII, Paragraph 7.1 by adding Paragraph 7.1(a), as follows:

7.1(a) Leadership Search Committee Composition and Responsibilities

"The Leadership Search Committee shall consist of no more than five (5) Nobles. The purpose of this committee is to study the qualifications of potential candidates for elective office in the temple. The committee may present its findings to the Board of Directors and/or the temple members in the form of a nomination at a temple election. Additionally, the committee may consult with the Chief Rabban on his appointments if so requested.

To ensure continuity, experience, and institutional knowledge, if available, three (3) of the appointed committee members shall be Past Potentates, meeting the following criteria:

- One (1) Past Potentate from within the last five (5) years,
- One (1) Past Potentate who served between five (5) and ten (10) years ago, and
- One (1) Past Potentate who served more than ten (10) years ago.

The remaining two (2) members, shall be Nobles in good standing, with demonstrated leadership and commitment to the temple."

This is the official written notice of the proposed change.


