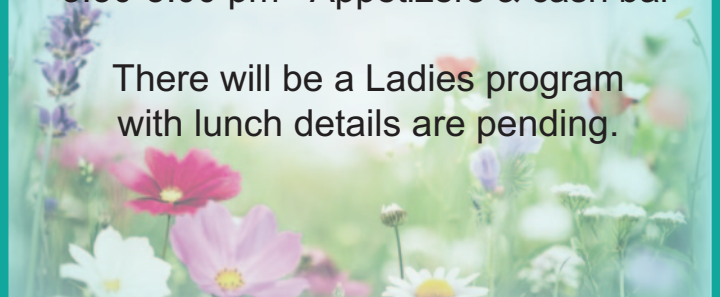

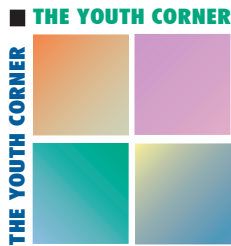
This month, I challenge each of us to make one intentional connection.

Hospital & System Update

Shriners Children's continues to advance Vision 2035 with important leadership appointments and measurable progress across our system.

Welcoming a New Central Region Administrator

We are pleased to welcome Amira Welch as the new Central Region Administrator. In this role, she will provide strategic leadership across the Central Region and help guide continued progress toward our Vision 2035 goals. Strong regional leadership is critical as we focus on growth, operational excellence, and ensuring children receive the right care, in the right place, at the right time. We look forward to the experience and direction she brings to our hospitals and outpatient locations.

As the search continues for a permanent Chicago Administrator, sincere appreciation is extended to Matt Lucas for his steady leadership and support as Interim Administrator. His guidance during this transition has been instrumental.

Research & Innovation Leadership

Shriners Children's has also appointed Alison Cernich, Ph.D. as Director of the Shriners Children's Research Institute — an important step forward in strengthening research and innovation across the system.

Dr. Cernich brings extensive leadership experience in child health, rehabilitation medicine, and disability research, including senior roles at the National Institutes of Health, the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs, and the U.S. Department of Defense.

She will oversee recruitment of researchers and development of the Institute's new 150,000-square-foot laboratory space in Atlanta. The objective is clear: accelerate discoveries and move innovation from the laboratory into clinical care more efficiently, improving outcomes for children and families throughout our network.

Operational & Clinical Progress

The MRI/CT construction project continues to move forward following permit approval. Construction is expected to last several months, with the imaging suite anticipated to become operational this summer. This expansion enhances diagnostic capabilities and strengthens our ability to deliver advanced specialty care. Vision 2035 initiatives also include continued focus on

operational excellence. Recent system-wide training for providers emphasized improved CPT and ICD coding accuracy, supporting both compliance and financial stewardship.

Collaboration remains strong across the system. Members of the Shriners Children's Medical Group conducted a site visit to review clinic operations, care pathways, and advanced practice provider models. These efforts support consistency, efficiency, and high-quality patient care.

International outreach clinics remain a key growth strategy, expanding access to specialty services while extending our mission beyond domestic facilities.

Research initiatives continue to advance as well, including new proposal opportunities supporting orthopedics and artificial intelligence innovation.

Patients and families appreciate our ear, nose and throat (ENT) physicians in the craniofacial/cleft program at Shriners Children's Chicago. We celebrated them during Kids ENT Month in February. We have 5 ENTs who evaluate patients to address concerns which might include is a child sleeping well or having issues with clogged ears, which are more common in children with clefts.



Having ENTs on staff is part of Shriners Children's multidisciplinary approach to treating our young and mighty patients. ENTs

like Kathryn Colman, M.D. who work in our Thursday cleft 'team day', will also surgically place ear tubes, and can remove tonsils and evaluate adenoids if there are issues related to cleft/craniofacial conditions.

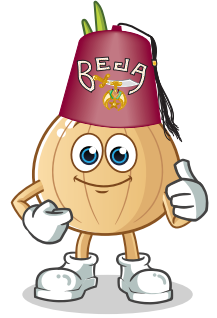

Thank You

A big thank you goes out to all Nobles who have already paid for their Noble Tickets or returned unused tickets. A list of those paid to date appears elsewhere in this Bugler. We also thank everyone who has sold Program Ads. On average, each ad generates about \$275 for Beja operations — a strong return for minimal effort.

Noble Tickets

As we move into April, please continue to pay for your Noble Tickets. At \$80, they remain a great value and an important part of our Circus revenue.

Program Ads

If you haven't yet sold an ad, please consider making the effort. Selling just 15 ads brings in \$4,125 for Beja.
