

Shriners Children's Chicago helps create real-life Cinderella story

For most teenagers being voted queen would be the memory they carry forward from senior prom. But Jennessa, 17, from eastern Iowa, will also remember her shoes thanks to care she received at Shriners Children's Chicago. The teen was able to wear the cute sneakers she hoped for when a childhood orthopedic condition threatened her footwear goals.

Pediatric orthopedic surgeons treated Jennessa for macrodactyly as a child, a condition where the toes and foot may develop bigger. In



2023, she returned to Shriners Children's with a new goal, to wear sneakers at prom.

Six months before the dance. Clark Schierle, M.D., Ph.D., used liposuction to remove extra tissue on her the foot. However, a rare infection put her fairy tale moment at risk. The team performed several procedures leading to successful skin graft. Jennessa was able to wear white sneakers to prom and was even crowned Prom Queen. "I remember receiving a text that night in April and seeing pictures from prom. I was sobbing in my kitchen tears of joy thinking this is why Shriners Children's is amazing!" said Dr. Schierle.

Conveniently located inside the reputable Hospital Angeles del Carmen, the clinic will provide muchneeded pediatric orthopedic care to children from Jalisco and surrounding states, eliminating costly, timeconsuming travel to Shriners Children's Mexico in Mexico City.

"This is an enormous advancement for Shriners Children's in Mexico," said clinic manager Omar Cardenas Magaña, M.D. "Providing care regardless of a family's ability to pay will make a big difference in the lives of these children."

Local dignitaries, media, Patient Ambassadors and Shriners from across Mexico and beyond attended the news conference and ribbon-cutting ceremony before touring the brand new facility. In their remarks to the audience and local media, Briana and Juan Pablo, both Patient Ambassadors from Guadalajara, expressed gratitude to Shriners Children's for helping them heal and pursue their dreams.

"When I was 2 years old, I was in a car accident and lost my right leg and part of my left foot," Briana told the overflow crowd. "When I was 4 years old, I became a patient at Shriners Children's Mexico. Through many surgeries, physical therapy and prosthetics they helped me become a decorated para-athlete, winning many international swimming competitions."

In addition to a large, freestanding hospital in Mexico City, Shriners Children's now has outpatient clinics in Tijuana, Monterrey, Culiacán and Guadalajara. Plans are underway to construct a fifth clinic in the northern city of Chihuahua later this year. Adding new access points is part of Shriners Children's international strategy to care for more children in more places, closer to their homes.

Congratulations to our dedicated research and medical staff for submitting an impressive eleven Shriners grant proposals. Notably, nine of these proposals were multicenter grants, fostering vital collaborations with Shriners facilities in Montreal, Northern California, Philadelphia, Portland, Lexington, Boston, Greenville, Mexico City, and Salt Lake City. These groundbreaking projects were largely inspired by insights from the recent Shriners Children's State of Research: Special Emphasis on Muscle and Bone Health event at Georgia Tech, Atlanta, Georgia. We are particularly excited about our continued collaboration with Georgia Tech, leveraging their pioneering technology in Artificial Intelligence and sensor development for sleep monitoring and activity tracking at home. A special thanks to Sahar Hassani, Dr. Karen Kruger, Dr. Joe Krzak, Adam Graf, Dr. Chad Purnell, Dr. Haluk Altiok, and Dr. Joseph Smith for their exemplary efforts, often working evenings and weekends to meet the deadline.

Additionally, we celebrate Dr. Kruger for securing her NIH grant with the University of Utah for her project on "Post-Surgical Form and Function of Planovalgus Foot Deformities in Patients with Cerebral Palsy." We wish her continued success in this significant endeavor.

Shriners Children's Chicago has recently garnered recognition at several prestigious national and international meetings. Kudos to Ben Smith for winning the best paper award in the Cranio/Maxillofacial category at the 2024 Midwest Association of Plastic Surgeons 62nd Annual Meeting for his outstanding paper, "Modeling the Effects of Orthognathic Surgery on Obstructive Sleep Apnea using Novel At-home Wearable Sensors."

We also extend our congratulations to Drs. Kathy Zebracki, Kyle Deane, Sue Mukherjee, Justine Stewart, Ali January, and Olivia Clark for their insightful presentations at the American Spinal Injury Association Conference, which highlighted their groundbreaking spinal cord injury research.

The Motion Analysis Centers have been steadfast collaborators in research for many years, recently publishing papers on clinical standards, machine learning, knee height asymmetry in biomechanics, and the use of fluoroscopy. Hats off to Drs. Karen Kruger, Haluk Altiok, Joseph Krzak, and Adam Graf for their remarkable contributions.

We are thrilled to report a significant increase in new patients this year, with a 30% rise in 2024 compared to 2023. From January to April 2023, we saw 1,437 patients; this year, the number has risen to 1,874.

Our dedicated fundraising efforts have enabled the Special Bikes for Special Kids program to acquire ten custom-adapted bikes this year. Since its establishment in 2011, recreational therapists have identified children who require specially adapted bikes. Families submit heartfelt letters requesting these bikes. Witnessing the joy on the faces of children as they receive bikes tailored to their specific needs truly demonstrates the program's positive impact.

Helping Children through Motion Analysis



For some children, coordinating complex movements like running with their friends, picking up a pencil, or throwing a baseball can be uncomfortable, difficult, or even impossible.

As a child grows and develops, so does their ability to move. When a child has a condition that changes typical development and makes movement difficult, advanced diagnostic techniques may be necessary to understand fully what is causing the movement problem. Motion analysis can help us understand the movement of children with neuromuscular, acquired or congenital disorders and develop an appropriate plan based on what we learn.
