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Shriners Children's Chicago: Making Strides in Care, Research, and Recognition

Shriners Children's Chicago continues to shine as a national leader in pediatric specialty care, recently earning top honors from Forbes Magazine as the #1 Midsize Employer in 2025. This distinction reflects the dedication and professionalism of the entire team—staff, board members, and volunteers—who make the hospital a remarkable place to work and receive care.

The hospital recently celebrated several important occasions, including Speech-Language-Hearing Month, National Hospital Week, and National Nurses Week. These events highlighted the vital work of our clinical teams and included uplifting celebrations like an ice cream social to thank the staff.

Recent advancements at the hospital include the successful launch of a new Fracture Clinic and an outreach clinic in Champaign, Illinois, expanding access to care for more children across the region. The team continues to refine operational practices, from physician coding training to improving patient satisfaction metrics such as "Likelihood to Recommend."

Physician recruitment remains a priority, with ongoing efforts to fill key roles, including a full-time geneticist and part-time hand surgeon. Strategic partnerships with Cook County Health, Rush University, and the University of Illinois are also being strengthened to support clinical growth.

Exciting progress is being made on facility upgrades, with plans underway to create space for an in-house MRI and CT scanner in the former laundry area. In addition, a new grant-supported research initiative will bring advanced standing CT imaging to assess pediatric flatfoot deformities, enhancing the hospital's diagnostic capabilities.

Research efforts are thriving, with eight grant proposals submitted this cycle—four short-term development grants and four long-term studies. These collaborative, multi-site projects address conditions such as cerebral palsy, neuromuscular disorders, craniofacial anomalies, and more, bringing together experts from eleven Shriners facilities and university partners.

The addition of the Fracture Clinic has helped increase new visits, while staffing efficiencies have been implemented in key departments, helping Shriners Children's Chicago improve performance metrics and deliver more value.

- Sponsorship Night Tuesday,11/25 7-10pm. Sponsors will be provided five (5) tickets to this special Event with 5 drink tickets and assorted appetizers. Raffle ticket purchases will be available.
- Liability Beja Shriners, Beja Shrine Center, Shriners International and Shriners Hospitals for Children are not responsible for any loss or damage to any sponsored owned or furnished items during the event. Not liable for any accidents or bodily injury that may occur on the event premises.

#### TREE SPECIFICATIONS

- Tree spaces are 6 foot by 6 foot (all trees, gifts and related items must fit in the assigned area)
- Trees must be a minimum of four (4) feet unless pre-approved by the Feztival of Trees staff.
- Trees must be artificial
- Trees must have LED lighting ONLY
