

How many Chicago Hospital and Twin Cities Clinic Patient Visits

Recently at an ASC Club meeting held at the famous Mark's Eastside Restaurant I was asked how many Beja patients we have driven down the first 6 months of 2024 to Chicago and how many to the Twin Cities Clinic.

And how is our Beja Transportation Fund being used?

So, I reached out to the **Beja Hospital Chair PP John VanLanen** for that answer.

Beja has had a total of 16 driver/patient/parent trips between Chicago and Twin Cities.

(That is an average of 2.66 children per month).

Driver trips mean we are transporting with the New Beja Hospital Van.

There were a total 18 parent/patient trips between Chicago and Twin Cities. (That is an average of 3 children per month).

Parent trips mean that the parents are transporting the child to and from using their own vehicle.

So that's a total is 34 total trips. Per John Chicago had 30 total trips and the TC 4 total trips.

Also, we used approximately 10 different Beja drivers and assistants so far.

As always, a heartfelt Thank you to all the drivers and assistants.






PACKERLAND CLAN 181 FALL REUNION SATURDAY, OCTOBER 19TH - 2:00PM - ???
