



## Jayden overcomes injury, will play college football

Jayden, 18, a patient at
Shriners Children's Chicago,
suffered a complete fracture
of his femur at football camp
before high school. After
emergency surgery out-ofstate, Jayden returned home.
His mother, Jacky, researched
orthopedic surgeons online,
which led them to Shriners
Children's. From the moment
she called, Jacky knew they
were the right place.

"Football is Jayden's life ... I'm

not just going to go to any doctor, I'm going to find the best doctor for him because this is something that he loves," Jacky said.

Once told he may never play again, Shriners Children's orthopedic sports medicine and physical therapy treatment kept Jayden on the team. The team also helped with a later shoulder injury. This fall Jayden will play college football in the state of Wisconsin.









At Shriners Children's Chicago, our leadership team remains focused on delivering excellence through our strategic plan and the Kaufman Hall performance dashboard. This ongoing effort centers on four key priorities: providing the Best Care, delivering More Value, reaching More Kids, and serving in the Right Places. These pillars guide our clinical and operational goals as we continue to expand and innovate.

One area of continued growth is our Fracture Clinic, which has seen increasing patient demand. We are also broadening our outreach footprint and actively exploring opportunities to establish new Orthopaedic and Rehabilitation clinics throughout the greater Chicagoland area. These potential locations would bring our specialized pediatric care closer to the families who need it most.

Our PROMIS (Patient-Reported Outcomes Measurement Information System) compliance rates are steadily improving. As we gather more data, we will be analyzing our PROMIS outcomes in depth to identify new opportunities to enhance patient care and overall experience. This effort will help us further refine how we measure success from the patient's perspective and ensure continuous improvement in clinical outcomes.

In alignment with best practices in revenue cycle management, our physicians, nurse practitioners, and physician assistants are receiving training and individual feedback from the coding team at Headquarters. This training is designed to strengthen our coding accuracy and improve charge capture. To further reinforce this initiative, we are coordinating additional education sessions for clinicians across the Midwest region in partnership with Karen Zupko & Associates, a nationally recognized healthcare consulting group.

On the research front, we're proud to share that Karen Kruger, PhD, will be representing Shriners Children's Chicago at the upcoming International Society of Biomechanics (ISB) conference in Stockholm, Sweden. Dr. Kruger has been invited to participate in a special workshop titled "The Pursuit of Standardization in Joint Kinematics: Towards Consensus for Knee, Shoulder, and Ankle Kinematics Output and Interpretation." In addition to this collaborative workshop, she will also be presenting four abstracts at the conference—a testament to the strength and impact of our research team.

### TREE SPONSOR RULES AND GUIDELINES BASICS

- Time and Place Feztival of Trees will be held from Wednesday 11/26 Sunday 11/30, closed on Thursday 11/27 Thanksaiving Day
- Application Deadline All applications must be submitted or staff notified by October 1, 2025
- Set up time The set-up time for a sponsor to set up their tree is Sunday 11/23 or Monday 11/24 10am-7pm.
- Sponsorship Night Tuesday, 11/25 7-10pm. Sponsors will be provided five (5) tickets to this special Event with 5 drink tickets and assorted appetizers. Raffle ticket purchases will be available.

### TREE SPECIFICATIONS

- Tree spaces are 6 foot by 6 foot (all trees, gifts and related items must fit in the assigned area)
- Trees must be a minimum of four (4) feet unless pre-approved by the Feztival of Trees staff.
- Trees must be artificial
- Trees must have LED lighting ONLY
- Sponsors are asked to choose a theme for their tree decorations that are appropriate for the public and represents their business, organization or family. Beja Feztival of Trees reserves the right to not allow any tree deemed inappropriate.
- Creative and non-traditional trees are welcome if they follow the tree rules.
- Each tree will be provided with one electrical outlet to use. Sponsors must use the assigned electrical outlet. Feztival of Trees staff will be available to assist with electrical connections.
- Sponsors should provide one (1) extension cord with UL or ETL listed. It is recommended that the cord be 15-20 feet long. The cord will be given away with the tree.
- Empty tree boxes and other reusable packaging will be held by the Feztival of Trees staff and provided to the tree winner

### **PRIZES**

- The winner of each tree will receive everything displayed, (including the tree, decorations and presents under the tree) unless specific items are marked and labeled. Sponsor display signs and event decorating remain the property of the Beja Feztival of Trees.
- High-Value prizes will be safeguarded by the Feztival of Trees staff.
- Presents related to the trees theme should be displayed under the tree and unwrapped for the guests to view.
- Cash or high-value items should not be placed on or under the tree. These items will be held by the
  Feztival of Trees staff and issued to the tree winner at pickup. Instead, sponsors can use photos, fake
  money, or a letter explaining the prizes.
- Alcohol is allowed as a decoration or placed as a gift with any tree. Tree Raffle with alcohol must be 21 to participate.

### **EVENT CONCLUSION**

- On the final day November 30th at 4pm, the prize drawing will be held in accordance with the Wisconsin raffle requirements. All raffle items must be picked up at the conclusion of the event on 11/30 from 4pm-7pm or make arrangements with the event coordinator.
