

In case you missed the September Beja meeting, I am going to pass along some information you missed. The Trustees Rainy-Day fund is an account that was set up around the year 2000. The fund helps pay for improvements, repairs, replacements and unexpected expenses that occur to our building, contents and furnishings, as well as the rest of the property that Beja owns.

Did you know that it takes approximately \$16,000 per month to operate Beja and keep our doors open. The main source of income for our operations is our Shrine Circus. This year, our circus lost a substantial amount of money. So far this year, the Trustees have transferred \$90,000 to Operations from the Rainy Day Fund.

It is projected that the Rainy-Day Fund will have an end year balance of between \$10,000 to \$15,000. The Trustees are asking all groups and units to consider making donations to the Rainy Day Fund, or Operations at the Parade to Glory in November. We would like to build the fund back up so we can pay for projects needing to be accomplished.

We also need to keep in mind that we are competing with the NFL draft next year so we need to plan for another circus they may not be well attended. This means Operations would not have the funds to cover our expenses.

The Memory Garden still has bricks for sale. We have about \$4000 worth of bricks on hand.

The last item is very important, our building security. It is very important that the building be locked and the alarm activated when it is not occupied. You are not to leave the building unlocked when you are not in close proximity to the doors. Again, if you or your group leave the doors unlocked or the alarm system deactivated, you will be assessed a \$50 charge which covers the time and mileage necessary to check the building and secure it. Also make sure your vehicles are locked while you are in the building.

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Message From The Beja Treasurer

At the September stated meeting, Jay Andres, Trustee President, gave a brief history of the Rainy-Day Fund. As Jay mentioned, the fund was established in 2000 to keep financial reserves available in case the circus or other event forced Beja operations to not meet its budget. From 2000 to 2015, surplus from circus budget funded the account. Beginning in 2016, Beja operations has needed transfers from the account 7 years in order to "keep the lights on". Two of those years were due to the Covid pandemic, but five years were due to deficits in Beja fund raising.

On a positive note, you, the Nobility have stepped up through donations from the Clubs & Units to replenish Rainy Day funds as they were used to balance the budget. As the Divan continues to cultivate other fund raisers, we hope the 2024 Parade to Glory will once again see substantial donations to help offset the loss from the 2024 Circus. Below is a table of Rainy-Day activity since 2016 outlining the causes of Rainy-Day nee.
























PACKERLAND CLAN 181 FALL REUNION SATURDAY, OCTOBER 19TH - 2:00PM - ???

Shriners Chicago has experienced significant increases in outpatient clinic visits, surgeries, and rehabilitation services. This rise in activity is a testament to the dedication and commitment of our entire team, who continue to provide exceptional care to our patients. We extend a heartfelt thank you to everyone for their coordinated efforts in making Shriners Chicago not only a center of outstanding medical care but also a great place to work. Together, we are making a positive impact on the lives of our patients and their families.

This summer, we also had the pleasure of holding two successful and impactful meetings with our partners at Stroger Hospital of Cook County and UI Health. During our meeting with Richard Keen, MD, Chairman of Surgery, and Paul Lamberti, MD, Chief of Orthopedic Surgery at Stroger, we explored ways to enhance our services through a pediatric orthopedic clinic and call coverage. This collaboration will strengthen the care we provide to children in the Chicago area.

For our annual affiliation meeting with UI Health, we were joined by leadership from both Shriners headquarters and UI Health, including Dr. Leslie Stewart, Chairman of the Board of Trustees, and John McCabe, Executive Vice President. Together, we reviewed our partnership agreement, which covers essential medical services such as anesthesia, pathology, infectious disease, and genetics, along with residency and fellowship programs. We are also excited to explore opportunities to expand our pediatric orthopedic surgery services at UI Health, further enhancing our collaboration.

On the community front, Dr. Zebracki and Dr. Gupta recently spoke at the *Higgy Con* conference in Rosemont, a national scoliosis support group that brings together families from across the country. Special thanks to Kara Miller for arranging this opportunity and to our staff, Kelsey Greiner, Kelly Rammel, and Linda Cree, for their invaluable support.

Additionally, our hospital hosted a virtual grand rounds this month on "Addressing Pain Using the Biopsychosocial Model," presented by Justine Stewart, PsyD, our Clinical Psychology Postdoctoral Fellow. It was a great success, and we are grateful to everyone involved for their hard work.

On the medical staff front, we are excited to welcome Continued in next column Cathy Alvarez, NP, to our Plastic Surgery program. Cathy brings nearly 20 years of experience as a pediatric nurse practitioner, and we are thrilled to have her on board. We are also in the process of recruiting a hospitalist and a part-time orthopedic hand surgeon to further strengthen our medical team.

In other news, our Radiology department passed the Illinois Emergency Management Agency's annual state radiation survey with full compliance on August 8, 2024. We expect the official report in the next 30 to 45 days.

Looking ahead, Shriners Chicago is expanding its presence in central Illinois with a new clinic in partnership with Carle Health in Champaign, IL. We are planning four orthopedic clinics per year, beginning in 2025, with Dr. Capello and Dr. Miller leading the efforts. This expansion will increase referrals and access to our services, helping us reach even more children in need.


