THE CHAPLAIN'S CORNER

This article by J. A. Davidson offers a helpful insight as we seek to meet the challenge for real living.

"Alberto Giacometti, the swiss artist who died in 1966, did a sculpture which shows five men walking toward one another. A viewer's first impression it that these men are going to meet, but close examination shows that no two paths will intersect. Each Man – a thin angular figure will pass in front of, or behind, all the others, each going his lonely way through the bleak world. Giacometti called this work of art, City Square: it ironically delineates the great pervasive problem people in our terribly complicated world – the problem of the isolation of the individual – of separation and alienation."

Davidson goes on the say, "When I saw a good photograph of the sculpture – I have not seen the work itself – I was reminded of a simple but profound statement by the Jewish Philosopher, Martin Buber: 'All real living is meeting.' Giacometti seems to have recognized that -and then, sadly and wistfully, declared the great difficulty of its realization."

Fortunately, for us, all those person involved in modernizing the Shrine Healthcare System did meet. Real living took place. Our healthcare system was modernized and with the real possibility being stronger.

The Shrine originated when some Masons thought Free Masonry should have an organization where we can have our paths intersect with others, a place of meeting where real living can occur.

And then, the Shrine became a place where we unite in a great cause and strive to make our paths intersect with the paths of children with special needs. And when our paths intersect with the paths of these children their future becomes much brighter because of the medical care we give them. When we are Love to the Rescue then we are Shriners having fun helping kids and real living takes place.


We had a great Spring Ceremonial and created eleven new Nobles, however, so far this year the Black Camel has exceeded our creations and there are still three months left in the year.

Imperial Potentate Jeff Sowder asks that every Noble find 'Just One' new member to help rebuild our Fraternity to the stature it once had. Beja Shriners started out in 1986 with over 1,000 members. Today we have less than 400. If each of our active members would refer 'Just One' good man for membership our temple will benefit, Shriners International will benefit, and our philanthropy, Shriners Hospitals for Children will benefit. Will you find that 'Just One' for the Fall Ceremonial? Fees for a candidate joining in the Fall Ceremonial total \$130. That includes the initiation fee, prorated dues for 2019, and the hospital and per capita assessments (a Fez is not included, but can be ordered or a used Fez may be available for purchase). 2020 dues of \$89 will be due by December 31, 2019.

Hardcopy dues notices were mailed the week of September 16th. Nobles who have not paid their 2020 dues, or are in arrears for 2019 or past years, will begin receiving their hardcopy notices in the mail. You may remit your dues in one of three ways, mail, phone, or online. If you call the office to pay over the phone a \$3 convenience fee will apply. New this year, you may pay online at webfez.shrinenet.org. If you have a balance a 'Pay Your Bill' button appears on your page. You may safely follow that link to remit your dues. This service has been approved by Shriners International and immediately updates your Shrine record. Remember, your dues are payable PRIOR to December 31st.

The following guidelines apply to the use of social media by all Nobles, personally in his capacity as a Shriner, as well as on behalf of all Shrine Associations, Temples, Units and Shrine Clubs. Nobles should always be aware that all electronic communications are permanent and may be made public, even if deleted.

All internet and cellular phone based electronic communications must:

1. Be in compliance with and conform to the Code of Ethics of Shriners International (Bylaws §210.7).
2. **Reflect positively on Shriners International and Shriners Hospitals for Children. (emphasis added)**
3. Not contain content or commentary that is antagonistic, bullying, confidential, defamatory, harassing, offensive, political, pornographic, profane, racially motivated or religious.
4. Not contain a third party's copyrighted material, trademarks, service marks or other protected material. In addition, all official Association, Temple, Unit and Shrine Club social media websites and accounts must be accessible to and controlled by more than one administrator. Violation of these guidelines may be considered in determining whether such posts constitute conduct unbecoming a Noble.

"Mason of the Year" in 1998. He is also a dual member at Manawa Lodge.

He became a member of the Scottish Rite Valley of Green Bay and a Beja Shriner in 1996. He has served the Intercity Shrine Club as Vice President and is currently serving his last year as President. He is the Assistant Chief of the Crazy Kops and is a founding member of the Beja Stop Burn Injury Committee. He is a charter member of Packerland Clan 181 International Hillbillies. He has served in Beja's elected Divan beginning in 2012 and was elected and served as Potentate in 2016. 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Shriners Healthcare for Children *TWIN CITIES*

Exciting news from Shriners Healthcare for Children – Twin Cities. The University of Minnesota wants to spend about \$55 million to turn the Shriners Hospital in Minneapolis into an interdisciplinary research institute for kids' brain health. The U has struck a purchase agreement to acquire the Shriners Healthcare for Children-Twin Cities property on East River Parkway just south of Franklin Avenue for \$22.5 million, including the 103,000-square-foot hospital on the site, plus a small hotel and conference space, and a 172-space parking ramp on the 10-acre property. Shriners' medical services are moving to Woodbury. The U's Board of Regents, which has until Dec. 9 for due diligence, is slated to consider the purchase agreement at its meeting Thursday. The property is about a mile from the U's East Bank campus. If approved, the proposal calls for the U to spend an additional \$25 million to \$33 million to renovate the building into the Institute of Child and Adolescent Brain Health.

A ribbon cutting ceremony was conducted at our new outreach clinic site in Omaha Nebraska at the Boy's Town National Research Hospital. Over 60 Shriners and their Ladies were in attendance for the ceremony introducing the new Tele-medicine and clinic operations. During the ceremony, a Omaha family was on the tele-medicine site from Minneapolis. They shared they travel approximately 12 times per year and the new site will reduce their trip from 2 days to two hours. This is another example of our mission to treat more kids in more locations with a reduced draw on our endowment. Plans continue developing sites in Iowa, South Dakota and North Dakota to meet the needs of our kids close to home.

Work is progressing on our new Twin Cities clinic in Woodbury Minnesota. The goal is to have the building completed May 2020 and clinic operations beginning in June 2020. We continue to serve children throughout the Midwest in the largest catchment area in our system. The clinic will be modern and meet the needs of the services we provide. You may have heard we are closing, that's not true in fact we are rightsizing and growing. Your continued support of your Shriners Healthcare for Children's-Twin Cities is critical in our success.
