News from Shriners Hospital Chicago

Shriners Hospitals for Children

The Midwest Market Initiative continues to move forward. This initiative is to bring the Shriners facilities in Chicago, St. Louis, and Twin Cities together to optimize services. Business Development will be the next area realigned. Interviews are ongoing for the Midwest business development director for all three sites. Additionally, in the Midwest we have realigned and supported Shriners Children's - Twin Cities in the areas of human resources, supply chain, fiscal services, registered dietician, and information services support. Interviewing for leadership of both Twin Cities and St Louis is underway.

The new telehealth program, ViTel Net, went live on April 15th. The old system, Fast Track Video Visits (FTVV) will be discontinued as of July 1, 2021. The new system does provide a much easier and more friendly experience for patients and minimized the scheduling/registration workload from our patient access area.

SHC-Chicago is keeping a close watch on the COVID situation to determine when it would be safe to lift some of the visitation restrictions. Based on CDC guidelines we continue to wear masks and safely distance as a hospital.

Suicide screening is done as a best practice on patients 10 and older. If a patient is found to have expressed suicide ideation, they are further evaluated by social work or psychology and further referrals are made for follow up.

New patient referrals are at 2019 levels and the time to the next available appointment is within a few weeks for most service lines. The physician liaisons and community outreach are now able to resume face-to-face visits and attend local exhibits and conferences.

The new website launch has now been rescheduled to launch after the Imperial Session. The rebranding of the system to Shriners Children's should be completed by the end of 2022.

Shriners Hospitals for Children is serving more kids in more places, providing the most amazing care anywhere. Let's pray that our Pickleball tournament on July 31st is successful for the Beja Shrine!






