## Lawn Mower Safety

In 2010, approximately 253,000 people were treated for lawn mower-related injuries, nearly 17,000 of them children. By taking precautionary measures, serious and sometimes deadly injuries can be prevented.

#### To ensure lawn mower safety:

- Children under 6 years of age should be kept indoors during mowing.
- Never allow children to play with the mower, even when turned off.
- Do not use mower on wet grass as it may cause your feet to lose traction and slide.



Beja 2023 Circus has completed. It is time to thank everyone who had a part in the success of bringing our event to Northeast Wisconsin. Your hands, skills, voices and donated dollars accomplished this task. You can be proud of the efforts. Beja thanks you, as your Circus Chairman double the thanks.

Our profits come from primarily three sources. 1st the Resch Center net dollars come from attendance. Our attendee numbers were down. Other activities happening at the same time took up parking and other Packer construction also took up parking space. 2024 we will attempt to work with closer parking areas such as Stadium View. This experience was valuable. Inside the Resch was smoother than in 2022. 2. The next two income producers are very important as all money raised is Beja's 100% so we really control how well we do. We have lots of room to grow our Noble tickets.

The ticket package will change to 8 adult tickets as child tickets are readily available through the "bogo" method (buy one get one free) The Noble ticket package will have a value of \$160.00. We need a higher participation rate from those receiving tickets. Approximately, \$18,000.00 were raised by selling ads for the circus program. This dollar number can easily be doubled when all Nobles sell 2 quarter page ads to businesses they do business with. This is not a difficult task. All this money raised stays with Beja. Circus profited around \$40,000.00 in 2023. How about those \$40,000.00 performing buffalo?




