The Board of Governors approved the requests for treatment of eleven international patients. These patients hail from Europe, Africa, South America, and the Pacific. Our skilled staff will provide treatment to six patients with spine conditions, three patients with osteogenesis imperfecta (OI), and the remaining patients will be cared for by our orthopedic team. This highlights the exceptional expertise and commitment of the staff at Shriners Chicago.

The Board also approved the care of six overage patients who will be able to complete their care beyond their eighteenth birthday.

A site review has been concluded to identify the optimal location for the MRI/CT facility. Our hospital liaison will now present a summary of the review to the Joint Boards for their final approval.

Shriners Children's was featured on The CBS Evening News with Nora O'Donnel on Tuesday, June 20. This was a tremendous opportunity for millions of viewers to see our system and see why we say we provide The Most Amazing Care Anywhere. This story involves incredible custom cast art created by one of our pediatric orthopedic surgeons in the last few minutes of hand surgery, The casts not only make patients smile but they empower children in a situatuon which can feel out of their control. 
