THE POTENTATE'S MESSAGE



Greetings Nobles and Ladies,

My first Imperial Session was a wonderful and enlightening time. There is nothing quite like catching up with old friends and making new ones.

I'd like to thank Imperial Sir James Smith and his entire crew for putting on a great conference.

The thing I found most interesting was sitting through and voting on legislation. But before I get into how I voted and why on a few key pieces of legislation, I would like to echo a statistic Imperial Sir Matt Sturlaugson cited during his membership report: Membership in the Shrine is now below 200,000 Nobles, down from 500,000 members just a decade ago.

A few key pieces of legislation were voted down to try and remedy this decline. I voted no on both of them. The first would allow Temples the right to approve the membership of anyone they deemed to be of good character.

Just as we tell new Nobles at our Ceremonials, everything we do as Shriners starts with the Blue Lodge. It was a pretty moving experience to be sitting in a massive room filled with roughly 600 voting delegates and knowing we all came from the same place and share the same experience.

Our journey into the Mystic Shrine started when we took the same Masonic obligation and removing that requirement may lead to new Nobles but it would have an adverse effect on the current nobility. The motion failed 124-451.

The second motion I found interesting was brought forward by Imperial officers and it would allow Imperial to essentially create its own Temple. The intent was to allow international candidates the ability to join a temple when they wouldn't have that option in their home country. Realistically this would also allow a potential candidate who lives down the block from you to join the Imperial temple instead of Beja. I felt this could have been remedied by modifying the language of the proposed legislation, but that never happened. The motion failed 165-411.

Along with declining membership, the Iowa Corporation is seeing declining revenues and Imperial was advocating for an increase in the per capita tax from \$30 to \$50. This vote was a lot closer, but it ultimately failed 363-203. I also

voted no on this piece of legislation. Last year the Iowa Corporation ran a deficit large enough to warrant this change. Large enough if the decline continues, our fraternity is in serious trouble of dissolving in the next five years. I understand that, but I also understand that as a small temple, Beja faces similar problems. Our membership is now down to about 350 and was over 400 when I first came on the line.

We have had to make drastic budget cuts over the past few years, we haven't had a Circus in two years and currently we are about \$33,000 in the red. I wanted to see more from Imperial and proposals for making realistic cuts to the budget. One example is reducing the reimbursement for travel or hotels for Imperial Session. Moreover, Beja currently has about 15 Nobles on the Gilbert Fund, which I strongly believe in. It goes back to our Masonic obligation to help a fellow Brother when we can.

This change would have upped Beja's per capita tax payment for those Nobles by \$300 a year. Granted that's not a lot of money. However, with a deficit looming and membership declining, I want to make the most out of every dollar Beja has.

It was eye opening to see some of the larger temples and how their financial woes pale in comparison to ours. But this is the hand we were dealt and unless we start to stack the deck more in our favor with new Nobles, Beja will be in this same predicament for the foreseeable future.

As your elected Iowa Representative I had to pause and remind myself, I am voting for the good of the Beja Nobility. I believe I did that and I'm open to discussing with any one of you why I voted the way I did. One thing that did change at Imperial was requiring anyone who wishes to be Potentate to go through Assistant Rabban or Oriental Guide School in Tampa (now known as the Kosair Charities Shrine Leadership Conference).

I again voted no on this piece of legislation because realistically there may come a time when we would no longer be able to offer the option to cover travel expenses for those events. We also have a bevy of highly-involved and knowledgeable Past Potentates who would be more than willing to share their experiences to help members of the Divan as they move up. This was another piece of legislation I felt put small temples at a disadvantage.

In closing, as I was walking back to the hotel after the closing session, a man of less financial means stopped me and asked about the Shriners.

He noticed all the fezes around downtown and wanted to know what we do and why we do it and what exactly the Imperial Session consists of.

"Everything we do is about the kids," I told him.

News from Shriners Hospital Chicago

Shriners Hospitals for Children

Dr. Karen Kruger, Ph.D., has been named the director of the Motion Analysis Center, replacing Dr. Gerald Harris, Ph.D., who retired. Dr. Kruger, a biomedical engineer, has been with SHC-Chicago since 2019.

The new telehealth program has been named Shriners Children's Care Anywhere. The new program went live on April 15th and the old system has been discontinued. The new system does provide a much easier and more friendly experience for patients and minimized the scheduling/registration workload from our patient access area. The rebranding of our healthcare system to Shriners Children's is scheduled for January 1, 2023.

Masks are still required when visiting SHC-Chicago, but some other restrictions have been relaxed. Two adults are allowed to accompany their child to the appointment, however, only one adult is allowed to stay overnight with the child. Siblings are still not allowed to come to the hospital. The hospital administration is keeping a close watch on the COVID situation to determine when it would be safe to lift more of the visitation restrictions.

SHC-Chicago is continuing to utilize three operating rooms per week. The number of surgeries is constant with the complexity of the surgeries increasing resulting in a higher number of surgical minutes. This also results in a higher hospital daily census.

New patient referrals are steady and the time to the next available appointment is within a few weeks for most service lines.

Shriners Hospitals for Children is serving more kids in more places, providing the most amazing care anywhere. 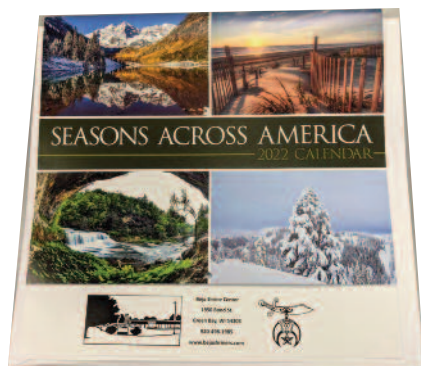

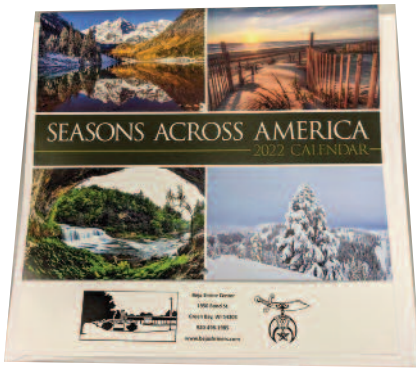
