Shriners Healthcare for Children **TWIN CITIES**

As summer feels like it is finally upon us and we emerge with little to no spring to speak of, Shriners Twin Cities is moving forward in developing the future ambulatory care clinic for Shriners Children's. A few weeks ago, I had the chance to represent Shriners Twin Cities at the annual gala where we gave an update on the work we are doing and the achievements we have made over the last year. While we still have a lot of work to do, we are making headway in developing our operations and enhancing service offerings consistent with a pediatric orthopedic specialty clinic. Such change continues to require our Board and staff to help educate and encourage organizational leadership to support necessary changes if Shriners Children's wants to stay relevant in serving children with the best care anywhere, regardless of their ability to pay or not.

A few notable accomplishments are in building existing and creating new relationships as we create a distributive model of care where we truly are able to offer the best care anywhere. These connections have been in lowa, Nebraska and Minnesota with a couple new relationships forming in South Dakota and Wisconsin, and more to come. Two other efforts are well in place with adding a sensory space for therapy treatment and by late summer we should be accepting direct referrals into Therapy. Additionally, we hired two key manager positions and we now have a medical director.

The excitement for even more lies ahead of us as we have just added a cranial helmet program with two of our POPS staff now certified to form and fit helmets as they work with our therapy team and Dr. Gibreel. By the end of the year, we should have a structured Spina Bifida program offering greater continuity of care than our current structure and we should be implementing a new EHR (Epic) which is better suited for an ambulatory care clinic.

Suffice to say, a lot going on and a lot more to do but we (our staff and each of you as Shriners) can and are doing it!

Patient Highlight — Eloise Cole



Eloise is a girl with a special spine: one that curved 37 degrees. This curvature was measured when Eloise was in sixth grade, but her doctor at the time did not prescribe her a brace, because they assumed she was done growing. The specialists they consulted also believed that the curve in her back would not get worse. Eloise was a student that enjoyed many extracurricular activities, such as modeling and playing volleyball for her middle school team. Soon the family realized Eloise was not finished growing. She grew 8 more inches by eighth grade. By the time she was a freshman, her back was a serious issue. "I started to have pain. I couldn't stand up for long periods of time. When I'd get home from school I'd lay down for a nap," Eloise said. A specialist said she needed surgery immediately to correct a spine curve of more than 55 degrees. Eloise's mother, Kim, searched for the right place to find treatment. Her boss told her about the world-class care provided at Shriners Hospital for Children Chicago. The family saw Michal Szczodry, MD, a pediatric spine surgeon who specializes in scoliosis and spinal deformities. Dr. Szczodry performed a spinal fusion on the 14-yearold. "Even though (surgery) was a long 12-hour day we knew she was in good hands," Kim said. A year later, Eloise was back in the game, modeling and playing competitive volleyball Recently, Eloise graced the runway at the Annual Medinah Ladies Fashion Show. She is now healthy and able to pursue her interests and many dreams, thanks to the care she received at Shriners Hospitals for Children Chicago. This fall, she will attend the University of South Florida, majoring environmental science.



Shriners Photo Tip Sheet

With their signature red fezzes, colorful costumes, offbeat parade vehicles, and fun events, we can all agree Shriners are quite the photogenic group! While posed snapshots and selfies are fun, the best photos for your print publications, websites, and social media pages might take a little more thought and consideration.

The best images create a narrative about our events, temples, or our fraternity and philanthropy and can be used for internal and external marketing and communications. The marketing and communications team at headquarters has developed a Photo Tip Sheet with tips to help you capture exciting and compelling photos. See the tip sheet elsewhere in this issue.

PHOTO TIP SHEET

How to capture images of Shriners that excite and inspire

As a fraternity focused on fun and fellowship, we have many opportunities to snap photos. That's why it's good to remember that the photos we may like best for our personal use are not always the same as the ones that capture the flavor of being a Shriner and tell our story most effectively.

That's because the purpose is different. We take photos for our personal use for many reasons. But mostly, it's because we want to remember a special person or a meaningful moment in time. Selfies and group selfies are great for that. They're fun to take and fun to look back on. Or maybe we want to be able to remember a gala's decorations or a festival's beautiful weather. Or how lovely our spouse, partner or kids looked that day. We don't necessarily care about lighting, composition or variety in our personal photos.

On the other hand, the most effective photos for marketing or publication purposes look different. To capture a reader's eye, they should have good composition and good lighting. They could suggest movement, emotion or a sense of place. We can use these kinds of images to create a narrative about our event, our temple, or our fraternity or philanthropy.

HERE ARE SOME TIPS TO HELP YOU CAPTURE THE MOST EXCITING PHOTOS FOR YOUR ONLINE AND PRINT PUBLICATIONS.

- Look for action shots, not posed photos or portraits.
- Look for Shriners and families having fun.
- Look for Shriners interacting with others.
- Look for Shriners helping people.
 - Handing someone a water bottle, working together on a project, assisting a child, volunteering, driving
- Take photos before and after an event, not just during.
 - Before: Shriners setting up tables or tents, unloading trucks, servicing motor corps vehicles, caring for horses
 - During: Shriners and families participating in activities, such as swinging a golf club or working a barbecue grill, taking tickets, twisting a balloon and handing it to a child
 - After: Shriners helping to clean up and break down event
- Look for Shriners of different ages doing things together or participating in the same event.

- Look for family groups of Shriners and Legacy Shriners
- Try to take tightly framed shots. Focus on the faces.
 - If you're shooting a band performance, focus on an individual player and his instrument, not the whole band. If shooting a parade, zoom in on car.
 - Don't worry about getting everyone in one picture. Instead, zoom in on small groups or one person and try to capture the emotion.
- Look for good lighting
 - Place light in front of subjects shining on their faces, rather than backlighting them.
 - For well-balanced lighting, ensure the subject is equal to or brighter than the background. For example, if you were to take a photo in the shade, make sure the background is also shaded versus a bright sky.





RULE OF THIRDS

Improve the composition of your images by using the rule of thirds. In this type of composition, an image is divided evenly into thirds, both horizontally and vertically, and the subject of the image is placed at the intersection of those dividing lines, or along one of the lines itself.



HIGH RESOLUTION

Photos that may be used in print need to have high resolution, otherwise they are likely to come out looking blurry or pixilated unless they are used at a very small size. To make sure your images are "high-res" follow these tips.

- Use a 2018 or newer iPhone or Android Device at highest resolution.
- If using a digital camera, use Large Jpeg settings.
- Always move closer to the subject and avoid zoom. Zoom often reduces resolution, especially when you zoom beyond 2x on a mobile device.
- Ensure the surrounding lighting is sufficient.
 Low light images become grainy and low quality.
- Avoid manipulation, cropping and zooming into images with photo editing applications and mobile apps.

Special Bikes for Special Kids broke a record this year by purchasing twenty custom-adapted bikes for our patients who applied. \$80,000 worth of bikes!


COVID is still a concern in the Chicago area. There have been several instances of staff. patients, and guardians contracting COVID.
