THE POTENTATE'S MESSAGE



Greetings Nobles and Ladies,

If November's Parade to Glory was indicative of anything, it was that Beja Nobles and Ladies are truly dedicated and passionate about continuing our mission. Clubs, Units, and individuals came together and gave more than \$52,000 to support a variety of needs we have as a temple.

Make no mistake, we have needs, but it was easier to fall asleep Wednesday evening after seeing such a strong show of support. The past 20 months have been a whirlwind of cancelled events, hampering our ability to get out in our communities and show people who we are, what we do, and why we do it.

That makes this amount raised even more impactful. Funds were given to our Operations Fund, Rainy Day Fund, Transportation Fund, our two clinics, the Parking Lot Fund and the Educational Fund. It was humbling, and one of my proudest moments ever as a Shriner, accepting donations for these areas of need.

To be honest, 2021 was a year no one could plan for. Being at the helm of such an important group during a time of crisis has personally taught many lessons, but the most important is that no Beja Shriner is ever alone. It doesn't matter if it was a \$50 donation or a \$15,000 donation, because every donation made at the Parade to Glory came from the same feeling of contributing to a group that is greater than one's self.

Donations came from single people wanting to make a difference, and they came from collaborative efforts and undertakings completed with the help of many. In the end, that's what it's all about.

Some Nobles and Ladies pour their hearts and souls into events like the John Ottum Memorial Golf Outing, others flip burgers and brats all day in front of a grocery store, others pound the pavement selling onions, a few help run a haunted house that is the envy of Shrinedom, others test the structural integrity of mini bikes delivering smiles at parades, and some just felt the need to open their wallets and personally make a difference.

Though the sizes of the checks varied, none of that matters to me. What matters is the motive behind those checks, the desire to help our fraternity thrive in many different areas during difficult times. *Continued in next column*

Before Wednesday's meeting officially opened, I gave a tour of our temple and new lodge room to a newly made Master Mason. It was his first time at a Shrine event. He asked what we do, and I walked him down the hallway filled with pictures of our Shriners Children's locations. I explained everything done at the local level helps us support these world-class facilities where the best speciality care is available regardless of the family's ability to pay.

I told him the writing on the bottom of the fez designates where a Shriner focuses their efforts, the club or unit where they devote time and energy to raise funds to maintain our ability to contribute. But I said the name "Beja" in studded jewels is what's really important, because that's our identity, it's who we are, and it's why such a wonderful group of people is able to come together. Thank you for showing that at this year's Parade to Glory, and making it a truly special evening.

News from Shriners Hospital Chicago

Shriners Hospitals for Children

As required by Shriners Hospital for Children®, all persons entering Shriners Chicago must be fully vaccinated and must wear a face mask while in the facility.

We wish our Hospital Administrator, Mark Niederprum, a long and happy retirement. Mark has been the administrator at SHC-Chicago for ten years and has been with the Shriners Hospitals for Children system for twenty-eight years! Mark's last day is December 17, 2021.

Beja's own Jim 'Jimbo' Herman has offered to recover all of the exam tables in the outpatient department and the arm cushions on the patient benches in the exam rooms to improve patient safety and avoid injury to the patients. Jimbo donates his time, talent, materials, and labor for the project. If you would like to help offset the cost of materials, please reach out to Jimbo.

The study to provide 6-8 outpatient exam rooms for use primarily by non-Shrine providers to include pediatric cardio, pulmonary, dental, and general pediatrics is proceeding. Requests for Proposal were sent to six firms and the responses are being evaluated at headquarters, who will make the final decision and approve and fund the project.

The surgical department is currently using three operating rooms per day averaging about 70 percent of capacity. Surgical minutes remain high (over 20,000 in a recent month), an indication of the complexity of the surgeries performed. The outpatient clinic volumes remain steady, seeing two hundred patients each month. The emphasis on utilizing telehealth visits is ongoing. Also, the rehab outpatient volumes are almost equal to that of the outpatient clinic.

The new hospital website, ShrinersChildrens.org, has been well-received. The website is mobile-friendly and allows users to request an appointment online. SHC-Chicago ranks number three in online appointment requests behind Canada and Mexico. The site will add a page for the Chicago research function in future updates.

Shriners Hospitals for Children is serving more kids in more places, providing the most amazing care anywhere. If you know of a child who could benefit from our services, ask the family to call SHC-Chicago at (773) 385-KIDS (5437), or call the national number, (800) 237-5055.
