News from Shriners Hospital Chicago Shriners Hospitals for Children

As required by Shriners Hospital for Children®, all persons entering Shriners Chicago must be fully vaccinated and must wear a face mask while in the facility. Additionally. hospital van drivers/assistants must be fully vaccinated to transport patients.

The Shriners Hospital for Childrens Regional Leadership Meeting was held in Chicago on December 13-14, 2021. The members of the Boards of Governors from Chicago, Ohio, St. Louis, and Twin Cities held information and networking sessions on the Midwest Initiative and more.

The surgical volume in 2021 and complexity remained high with surgical minutes exceeding 2019 and 2020 totals. As a result, we are excited to announce that SHC-Chicago has received approval to obtain an intraoperative CT (iCT) scanner. This will help technically with critical decisions during complex surgeries.

Outpatient volumes continue to remain strong averaging over 110 cases per day. The use of telehealth is encouraged and the number of telehealth visits is increasing.

The rehabilitation services department continues to see both inpatients and outpatients and have had to set up various treatment areas in a creative manner to treat more patients and still maintain social distancing.

The Chicago research page has gone live on the new hospital website ShrinersChildrens.org, highlighting SHC-Chicago's research function.

Shriners Children are serving more kids in more places, providing the most amazing care anywhere. If you know of a child who could benefit from our services, ask the family to call SHC-Chicago at (773) 385-KIDS (5437), or call the national number, (800) 237-5055.



This past year was not the year we envisioned. In short, membership was a disaster in 2021.

On the bright side, Beja was able to add six new Nobles to the membership roll. Two came by way of creation, two by affiliation, and two by restoration. The goal established at the beginning of the year was eighteen creations and seven restorations.

The losses create another story. Beja lost eighteen Nobles to the Black Camel (so far). On average, we will lose sixteen Nobles to the Black Camel every year, so this was expected, but it was still above average.

One Noble took a dimit to join a temple nearer to his home. Two Nobles resigned their membership for personal reasons. Four Nobles were suspended for not maintaining their membership in a Blue Lodge. And finally, seven Nobles were suspended for non-payment of dues (after two years).

That is a net loss of twenty-six and brings our current membership to 328. Beja has lost over one hundred members since 2015.

The membership goal for 2022 is to create at least sixteen (16) new Nobles (5% of our membership) while holding our suspensions to a maximum of seven (2%).

That is a lofty goal once again, but it is attainable if everyone works on membership. Every Noble of Beja Shrine is a member of the membership committee. All we ask is that you replace yourself. Get 'Just One' new Noble this year.

Membership growth is not an impossible task, but it does take commitment. Your membership team is committed to the task but to succeed we ask for the help of every Beja Noble and Lady. While you are together with your friends talk about the FUN Shriners have, whether they are Master Masons or not. Blue Lodges need new members, too. Invite your friends to the temple events that Potentate John Van Lanen has planned. Shriners Having FUN Helping Kids is not just a slogan, it is reality.

The Beja Spring Ceremonial is Saturday, March 19, 2022. Recruiting for the Spring Ceremonial should begin now! Will you find that 'Just One'? The fee for a candidate joining at the Spring Ceremonial is \$149. That includes the initiation fee, 2022 dues, and the hospital and per capita assessments (a fez is not included but can be ordered [the cost is approximately \$200] or a used fez may be available for purchase). If you need a petition, download one from the link in the weekly eBugler or call the office and Ann will send you one. Pick one up at Beja the next time you are there and keep it handy.

<u>BeAFreemason.org</u> and <u>BeAShrinerNow.com</u> are also good starting points for interested individuals.

If you have not yet paid your 2022 dues, or are in arrears for 2021, please remit the balance today. You are not a member in good standing if you are delinquent and therefore cannot attend any Shrine function or meeting, including clubs and units. If you are experiencing difficulties that prevent you from becoming current, contact the Recorder. There are procedures in place to help.

You may remit your dues in one of three ways, mail, phone, or online. If you call the office to pay over the phone a \$3 convenience fee will apply. You can pay online at webfez.shrinenet.org. If you have a balance, a 'Pay Your Bill' button appears on your page. You may safely follow that link to remit your dues. This service is by Shriners International and immediately updates your Shrine record.


