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The Chaplain's CORNER



"Just a couple days ago I chaired an interview committee for a petitioner at one of my lodges. It was quite the experience before, during, and after. It wasn't my first time doing this, but it was definitely the most emotionally charged. The petitioner asked a question that I don't think anyone had ever asked me before. "What does it mean to be an officer?"

As Chaplain in a million different areas, it's up to me to not only know, but to live by the charge I was given when I agreed to take the office. Most people think it's prayer at the meetings and that's about it. But there is a lot that goes unseen, like there is for all offices and chairs in Masonry. To me my duties are best summed up in the portion that says "You also bear the responsibility of keeping all the Brethren focused on the Sacred Law which is our Masonic Trestle board; steering and counseling them when their actions, prejudices, and desires infringe upon others; reminding them of their higher duty to the peaceful and harmonious service of God and man."

But as I spoke with this young man, my explanation evolved. I told him that while each office had authority and responsibility, the ultimate goal was to be of service to others. I told him that holding the offices just meant that we had the authority to perform our duties effectively, but that was all it really meant. I started to explain how things like awards were not used to bolster our position, but were just a symbol of thanks from those that we served.

I looked over and saw an expression of subdued shock on the face of one of the other members of the team. Not because he seemed offended, but because he didn't realize the way I viewed these things. This sparked a reminder for me that while we all work to the same ends, we don't always take the time to see the people around us, get to know them and how they see the world and what we do, or even understand the meaning of the things they do.

So I put all this together in hopes that it will get you to think about the people around you. Not just in what they do, but how they see things and why they do things. You never know what can happen, and you may find a beauty and perspective that you never thought you needed in your life."

Modifying Hospitals to Meet Expectations and Reach More Kids

Because the majority of pediatric medical procedures are now performed in an outpatient setting, we continue to modify our hospitals, where appropriate, making them outpatient centers through a variety of community-centered models. And we continue to strive to reach as many kids as possible who need our special brand of life-changing, compassionate care – wherever they may live.

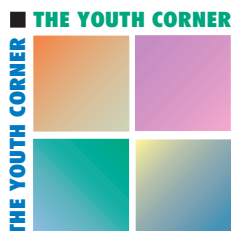
Increasing Our Numbers and Extending Our Reach

Through this emphasis on outreach and outpatient care, we are, in fact, caring for more kids than ever before. Prior to the pandemic, Shriners Children's averaged a 2.5% growth rate in patients seen year over year. Over the last 10 years, Shriners Children's has experienced a 26% growth in patients seen. Most importantly, 2021 encounters exceeded 400,000, the most in our history.

We will continue stressing the need to have fewer brick-and-mortar traditional hospitals, which are extremely expensive to operate while focusing on creating a cohesive network of ambulatory surgery centers and clinics supported by a range of collaborations and affiliations with other community health care providers. We will also continue to refine and emphasize our telehealth efforts, including offering more "at home" visits, especially via cell phone technology.

These points: changing our method of care delivery, being more convenient for families, operating efficiently, and reaching more kids, are the heart of Shriners Children's goals for the future.

While much is changing, our dedication and commitment to the mission of Shriners Hospitals for Children, and to always putting our patients first remains the same, as we look to the future with hope and confidence

News from Shriners Hospital Chicago

Shriners Hospitals for Children

All persons entering Shriners Children's Chicago must be fully vaccinated and wear a face mask while in the facility. While masking is not required in some areas of the city, there continues to be a mandate for masking in healthcare facilities. Additionally, hospital van drivers/assistants must be fully vaccinated to transport patients. Any changes in this policy will be communicated in our weekly newsletter, the eBugler.

Recruitment of staff remains one of Shriners Children's-Chicago's top priorities. Hospital leadership is currently reviewing candidates for the vacant Hospital Administrator. The administrator in Chicago will oversee all three facilities, Chicago, St. Louis, and Twin Cities. The Chief of Staff, Dr. Gupta, has interviewed candidates for an intensivist and a neurologist. Other staff vacancies are also being sought.

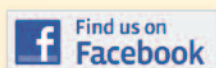
