SHC-Chicago hosted the Joint Boards while they were in the Chicago area for their Spring meeting. The Joint Board was given a presentation and a tour of the facility.

The Midwest Market Initiative continues to move forward. This initiative is to bring the Shriners facilities in Chicago, St. Louis, and Twin Cities together to optimize services. Mark Venable of the St. Louis hospital has been appointed as the Midwest Human Resources Director. Business Development will be the next area realigned. There will be one Midwest business development director for all three sites. Once this position is in place a determination will be made on the number and specific candidates for liaisons for each of the areas.

The new telehealth program, ViTel Net, went live on April 15th and the first patient visit took place during the week of April 24th. SHC-Chicago is one of four test sites for the new system.

Outpatient clinic visits (including telehealth) are at pre-COVID levels and the time to the next available exam is within thirty days for most service lines. The community outreach is beginning to attend in-person functions.

Shriners Hospitals for Children is serving more kids in more places and providing the most amazing care anywhere. If you know of a child who could benefit from our services, ask the family to call SHC-Chicago at (773) 385-KIDS (5437), or call the national number, (800) 237-5055.

Hope for Mateo

Thursday, May 28, 2020 Toddler from Dominican Republic receives care for rare hand condition



The team of physicians at Shriners Hospitals for Children — St. Louis sees a variety of upper extremity differences. One of the rarest is a condition called "mirror hands," which can present itself in a variety of ways but usually children are born with extra fingers and an extra ulna bone. This condition is so rare that there are only a few cases known worldwide. Two-year-old Mateo was born with mirror hands and had a duplication of the pinky side of his hand and forearm. His thumb side of his hand did not develop properly and he had seven fingers with no thumb.

Mateo's parents live in the Dominican Republic. They searched the internet for a doctor who could help their child. They found renowned upper extremity surgeon Charles Goldfarb, M.D., who has treated several other children with this same condition. With the help of the World Pediatric Project, an organization that helps international patients travel to the United States for treatment, Mateo and his parents came to St. Louis for evaluation and surgery.

Mateo's first surgery helped restore his elbow motion, as he does not have a normal elbow joint. Once he recovered from this surgery, he underwent surgery once again to remove his extra digits, create a thumb and bring his wrist into a straighter position. Having these surgeries "...will help him function better as he moves forward," said Dr. Goldfarb. The ultimate goal was to create the most functional and normal appearing hand and arm possible.

Today, Mateo is fully recovered from his surgeries and is just like every other high-energy 2-year-old! He will have yearly check-up appointments with Dr. Goldfarb and his team each year, but is not expected to have any more major surgeries.
