Phishing Attempt Targeting Nobles

Shriners International has been informed of a phishing email that targets Shrine Nobles with a false Membership Suspension Notice. This email appears to have been sent by Shriners International but is a fraudulent email. Please do not click on any links or take any action outlined in the email.

A copy of the email has been included below, and some tips to help spot fraudulent emails.

- Check the name of the sender. Does it look correct?
- Are there any typos or are there Shriners-specific terms that are incorrect?
- Be suspicious of any email that gives a sense of urgency and demands an immediate response.
- If you are unable to determine if the email is genuine or not, please send an email to WebFezFeedback@shrinenet.org BEFORE clicking any links

Wheelchair Funds And Pop Tabs at Work



Jonas Learns to Drive!

It's always exciting when your child learns to drive, but for Jonas' parents, they didn't expect that excitement when he was only 11 years old! While Jonas and his family were familiar with wheelchairs, the two that he has

had in his lifetime are miles apart in many ways.

Born with a genetic, progressive syndrome that affects growth and development as well as multiple organs, Jonas received his first wheelchair at 5 years old. This was a folding, growing frame manual wheelchair called the Zippie Xcape. This is the purple one shown below. It met his needs at that time, since he was still strong enough to push the wheels using both hands. He was proud of his ability to get around by himself, and this little chair fit well in his elementary school as well as his home.

However, by the time Jonas became 11, he was having more difficulty propelling a manual wheelchair. Although he wears glasses, his vision is good, and he is one smart kiddo. So, with some training sessions at Shriners Childrens Rehab Services Department he became a very good power wheelchair driver and ready to take on some new wheels.

In February, Dan from RDI, drove out to his house and delivered his brand new Pulse midwheel drive power wheelchair! Of course, Jonas picked the color, and showed that he is a super capable driver. His mom was very happy too, and sent the picture below as well as this note:

The hospital is also hiring a neurologist, and an intensivist, and is seeking more hospitalist coverage. The search for a new administrator is proceeding and applicants are being reviewed with the hospital leadership.

A virtual mock Joint Commission Survey was conducted to prepare for this fall's actual survey. The results showed the facility to be in compliance with standards overall and findings were minimal. Several items were noted to be best practices.

The Board of Governors met in person in April for the first time in two years. Currently, only the voting members of the board are meeting in person, with associate and emeritus members meeting virtually.


