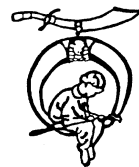
We are excited to announce that we initiated two new members on May 15th. Congratulations and welcome to Judith Kucksdorf and Amanda Iles.

Shriners Healthcare for Children

Twin Cities

Shriners Healthcare for Children—Twin Cities

Exciting things are happening at your hospital, below is and update on current issues. Please feel free to ask me any questions that you have regarding the changes occurring at our Twin Cities Location.

- **FUTURE SITE:** Recommendations regarding a future site in the Twin Cities metro area have been developed and approved by the Joint Boards. Lease negotiations are underway. Public communication of the future site will be initiated when the property is secured.

- **FUTURE SPACE PLAN:** We have completed a preliminary space programs (departmental spaces) totaling 18000 square feet that would be built out in a new location. Final design will be completed after the site is secured.

- **CURRENT SITE:** Groups have been encouraged to submit proposals/offers to purchase the existing SHC building in Minneapolis by May 1. The sale of the current site will be coordinated with the development of a new site in mid-2020.

- **INPATIENT AND SURGERY SERVICES:** The service relationship with Gillette Children's Specialty Healthcare has been very positive. The quality of service and satisfaction of patients continues at a high level.

- **SHRINE FINANCIAL SUPPORT:** Financial support of patients needing assistance continues when services are provided at Gillette or other sites. A new process for getting financial support, however, requires the more active engagement of patient families.

- **EXPANDED OUTREACH:** Development of an expanded network of outreach sites continues. We are seeking to introduce telehealth services and an outreach model that offers more frequent clinics, but smaller clinics in remote sites. The intent is to provide more points of access with greater frequency. This model will replace the larger annual or biannual clinics at sites in the past.

- We are close to finalizing agreements with Boys Town National Research Hospital in Boys Town, NE that will enable periodic clinics, telehealth and eventually a camp for kids this summer. We have held 3 POPS clinics so far in Nebraska with another scheduled for the end of May. We expect to fully operationalize these services within the month.

- Host sites have been identified in Rapid City SD and Bismarck ND to create similar service arrangements to those in Nebraska. The initial focus of these sites will be telehealth services.

- There is great interest in developing a collaboration agreement with a major health system in Iowa. More information will be shared as these agreements are reached. Non-disclosure agreements prevent open communication.

Thank you again for allowing me to serve you as a member of the Board of Governors – Shriners Healthcare for Children- Twin Cities.

After a great deal of planning and searching, we will be moving to a new building in the City Place Development in Woodbury, Minnesota, an eastern suburb of St. Paul, Minnesota, by the summer of 2020. This move is a step in our transition to an outpatient clinic model. Construction of our new site will begin later this summer and continue into the middle of next year. The current site will be sold as the transition to the new site is completed.

Ease of highway access, proximity to other local area amenities, first floor access and the opportunity to design and build out space incorporating the knowledge gained from 96 years of service, were all elements that influenced the selection of the site and the timing of this transition. Developing a new site is a special opportunity to create a patient-centered environment for the modern era. The new site will continue to serve children from a seven- state service area.

Shriners Healthcare for Children's new facility will provide a wide range of services for children with orthopaedic conditions including:

- **Clinic Services:** providing a family-centered, team approach to care. Patients will see specialty physicians, nurses, therapists and other pediatric-trained specialists in an environment designed for children.
- **Child Life:** providing families with support during appointments through play and anxiety coping activities. The Child Life program also offers over twenty (20) camps and programs to meet the physical and emotional needs of children with orthopaedic conditions.
- **Radiology:** providing standard x-ray service as well as EOS, which provides 3-D, full- body imaging with up to 85 percent lower radiation.
- **Rehabilitation:** providing physical and occupational therapy to help children build skills, strength and mobility needed for everyday activities.
