
As Shriners we have two purposes. One purpose we have is, in the light of Free masonry, to have events and happenings that give us memorable relationships and activities.

2020 Imperial Session Cancelled

Based on data and opinions of public health experts and community officials, Shriners International has cancelled its 2020 Imperial Session in Kansas City. In determining whether the 2020 Imperial Session could be responsibly held, the perspective of Shriners International was to take a global vision with local focus. The Imperial Session is truly an annual international gathering at one physical location. The Imperial Divan, the 2020 Convention Corporation, and the staff of Shriners International closely monitored developments and worked closely with the Kansas City Health Department in planning the 2020 Imperial Session. This planning was always undertaken with the hope and expectation that the convention would proceed, as long as it was reasonably safe to do so, based upon the trajectory of the Corona Virus and governmental quarantine and/or stay at home orders, actions based upon data and opinions provided by public health professionals.

Based on the information provided by public health professionals and recent governmental extension of existing public health orders, Shriners International determined that the safety of attendees and the safety of the community could not reasonably be provided on or before the start of the 2020 Imperial Session in Kansas City and therefore cancelled the 2020 convention, due to the impossibility of safely hosting it.

News from Shriners Hospital Chicago

Shriners Hospitals for Children

As is to be expected, our overall numbers are down because of Illinois' stay-at-home order, but our doctors are still seeing patients and are still performing surgeries. The number of surgeries are down, but surgical minutes are up indicating more complex surgeries are being performed.

Telehealth has expanded during this pandemic with the initial screening of new patients now being done via Fast Track Video Visits. This will soon be expanded to include rehab patients. This speeds up the time to initial visits and also cuts down on travel.

The Physician's Liaisons (PL) have been working from home contacting local doctors and clinics by telephone, email, and Skype/Zoom. They are letting the doctors in the Chicagoland area know that SHC-Chicago is available to free up their emergency rooms and urgent care centers by treating stable fractures and urgent orthopaedic needs for children 18 and under. Since the PLs have been in the field full time the number of referrals from local doctors has increased significantly.

SHC-Chicago is in the third year of its 5-year Strategic Plan. The plan has been approved by the Home Office and funding is in place to continue as planned. The Executive Committee is already looking beyond the five years to plan for the future of SHC-Chicago.

2020 SHRINE CIRCUS (that never was!)

We are all disappointed our Beja Shrine Circus could not be performed. It means a big loss to Beja because as our number one fund raiser for Beja's operations, we will need to look elsewhere for operating dollars. It will be necessary for our Potentate to make big changes to his planned programs. The Coronavirus has caused all of us to rethink our normal lifestyles.

Since much work has gone into planning of the circus I would like to bring everyone up to date as to what money has been raised. First I want to thank all participates in the Noble (Daddy Book) tickets sales. Your \$60. investment will go a long way in helping the Beja 2020 budget. Only one person asked for a refund and I commend all of you for your support. Over \$10,000. resulted from the Daddy Book sales. Second, out of the 25 companies or individuals who had already sent money in for their program ads, only two requested a return of their advertising dollars. (\$215.) The remaining 23 told us they would prefer donating the money back to Beja. An additional \$4,765. was raised simply by phoning advertisers and explaining our predicament. Too bad we didn't have another 23 who had already sent money. Telemarketing also raised approximately \$9,000. Of that total Beja receives 25% or \$2,250.

It is a long way from the \$70,000 we had hoped would come from the circus but it certainly is a nice help. A heartfelt thanks goes out to everyone who had a hand in the 2020 effort. Let's hope the 2021 Beja circus proves successful.

THE OLDEST LIVING SHRIMERS HOSPITALS FOR CHILDREN PATIENT TURNS 103!

Irene Hand Roberts just turned 103 and as far as we know, she is the oldest living Shriners Hospitals for Children patient! Irene was born on April 28, 1917, at her grandmother's restaurant and boarding hotel in McLaughlin, South Dakota.



In July 1923, at the age of 6, Irene developed what was called infantile paralysis, but is now known as polio. The Hand family and local doctors tried many remedies to help Irene, but they were all unsuccessful. Irene's luck changed when

a small-town horse-and-buggy doctor named Dr. Twining, who by chance was a Shriner, referred Irene to the newly opened Shriners Hospital for Crippled Children in Minnesota, thus beginning Irene's long and very hard road to recovery.

Irene spent many months at the Shriners Hospital in Minnesota. Her right leg recovered, but her right arm never did. Irene never let having a paralyzed right arm slow her down, though.

Back home Irene had to work very hard to catch up, as she had missed her entire second-grade year. With only one good arm, she experienced many challenges. Yet as time went on, Irene adjusted to her new life and learned how to do things differently.

In 1930, Irene's father moved the family to Miles City, Montana, after finding work as a railroad policeman for the Milwaukee Railroad. Irene was a determined young woman. After graduating from high school, she was in the first graduating class at the new Eastern Montana College in Billings, Montana, where she earned her teaching degree. After graduating, Irene taught school for one year in a one-room school in Ismay, Montana.

Irene met and married Byron Roberts when she was 21, and they have eight children spread out over 22 years. Irene has quite a few grandchildren, and two of her grandsons and one great-grandson played in the Montana East-West Shrine Football game! The family feels this is one way they have given back for the care Irene received from Shriners Hospital.
