Greeting Nobles and Ladies,

Cancelling the 2021 Beja Shrine Circus wasn't an easy choice.

Thought, research and work went into this, and ultimately the decision had to be made.

Thank you to Illustrious Sirs Dennis Korth, Gene Reece and Divan members John Van

Lanen and Tom Plufgardt for their efforts to come to this conclusion.

What most Noble and Ladies probably don't understand is before the lights go out and the first show begins, Beja pays a significant down payment each year for the circus. Couple our initial investment with the seating reduction at the Resch Center, and there was no possible way we could have grossed a profit.

Holding the 2021 Beja Shrine Circus would have put us in even more of a financial bind then what we currently face, and therefore it was decided not to continue.

Two things could have changed to allow us to gross a profit. The Circus promoter could have offered to reduce the amount we are required to pay, and more seats could have opened up at the Resch Center. Both of these seemed unlikely to happen, and we are already behind where we would normally be in terms of program ad sales and Daddy Books.

If by some miracle an extra seven percent of seats opened, and we had the best year ever for program ad sales, even though we were starting from behind the 8-ball, we may have grossed a few thousand dollars at best, or at worst lost several thousand.

When we originally decided to move the circus to the Resch Center, my hopes grew that we could pack the building, and in turn secure funding to run Beja for the year. Then COVID happened, and everything stopped.

Now we face a different reality and because of that we have made some proactive moves that I am hopeful will help cover the budget deficit.

You may have already received the first in the mail. This calendar program will be a replacement for the Daddy Books.

Please consider a donation, as this will be the only time in 2021 when Beja will directly ask you, our Nobles and Ladies to donate, outside of the Annual Pie Auction and the Parade to Glory.

The second is still a work in progress, but under the direction of Illustrious Sir Jim Van De Hey, we will be embarking on a cash raffle with a top prize of \$10,000 in cash, taxes already paid.

For this event we need to sell 500 tickets at \$100 each, and we can gross \$30,000.

In order to help us a bit in this endeavor, I have secured a free newspaper ad that will reach more than 250,000 people.

More details will be available soon on tickets, so please keep an eye out.

In regards to the Beja Spring Ceremonial on April 10th, I'm pleased to report Ralph Papesh will be the Class Honoree. When I think of Ralph, I think about what it means to be a Shriner.

He's quick with a handshake, quicker with a joke, holds the doors open for Ladies, volunteers his time, and is more than deserving of this honor. He is a great Shriner, a better man, and an asset to Beja. Next time you see Ralph, be sure to congratulate him.

This year our membership team has come up with the goal of 18 new Nobles. I know it seems high, but together we can make 18 new Nobles happen, and the first chance to get them involved and become part of Beja is on April 10th. Let's get those applications in.


reserved for family and spouse, they are words we can use every day.

Fellow Nobles,

I attended my first Beja stated meeting in 12 months on February 3rd, and to my dismay many Nobles were not wearing face coverings, nor were they socially distancing.

Some do not seem to take this pandemic seriously. But, I take it seriously – very seriously.

My first shot was February 1st, and my second is March 1st. Then, I'll observe two weeks of selfquarantine while the vaccine in me powers up.

In the months that follow I'll continue to mask up and social distance – not for my protection, but for the protection of those around me (that would be you). Just because I've been vaccinated doesn't mean that I can't pass this virus on to you – that's why we should wear a mask in the first place.

SHC-Chicago is currently seeing approximately 70 patients per week in the clinic with an additional 10-15 via Fast Track Video Visits. We are back to utilzing three operating rooms per day. The number of patients is rebounding since the recurrence of COVID in the Chicago area during November and December. The rehabilitation services department is seeing both inpatients and outpatients and have reconfigured the treatment areas to accommodate proper distancing. The waiting time to the next available appointment for most service lines is within three weeks.

2020 was a challenging year, but SHC-Chicago continues to strive to move our hospital forward. The orthopaedic surgery and rehab program grew with the addition of new doctors, our chest wall deformity program is underway, and we continue to strengthen our relationship with the University of Illinois and explore opportunities to collaborate with other hospitals in the area.




