Most who know me, know that I have been doing suicide intervention ministry work for many years, but this weekend was different. This weekend it was a brother. It wasn't some random

brother somewhere in the world, but someone that many of us in northern Wisconsin know. And someone who we know to be truly selfless. I am proud to say that this brother is doing well, and working toward a better tomorrow, but it did drive home the point that we are not paying attention to something that is affecting those closer to us than we realize. Oftentimes when we are hurting we don't know what to do or what to say, but just picking up the phone and talking to someone that values us can make all the difference. It's hard for those who answer those calls to know how to react, but the truth is that it's far better to spend an hour talking to someone than it is to spend 5 minutes giving a eulogy.

As masons we "Contribute to the relief of poor distressed worthy brothers", and as Nobles we spend a great deal of time helping the world around us by helping children in need. But there comes a time when we have to realize that what hurts one of us, hurts many. It was Br. Mat Shelton who had the idea of passing a hat full of names around the meeting and having every brother draw a name to contact by the next meeting. Eagle River Lodge passed out names to regular members for frequent contact. All so that they could just make sure that brothers and widows were doing well. Little things like this can make a tremendous difference. In some cases, the effort to let people know we care can mean the difference between life and death, even when those we reach out to don't admit they are hurting.

It's easier than we think to find just a few minutes during the day to check on those that we care about. And that is far better than wishing we had when it's too late. We all have a few minutes where we just mill about doing little or nothing, and that is the perfect time to think of those that we care about. While that doesn't mean we should give up all our free time to help others because we all need a rest, it is my hope that this serves as encouragement to add reaching out to those you care about to your list of things to do. And we should always remember that to be truly selfless we have to be as willing to receive as we are to give. But the few minutes we spare for others can save a lifetime of remorse. All persons entering Shriners Children's Chicago must be fully vaccinated and must wear a face mask while in the facility. Additionally, hospital van drivers/assistants must be fully vaccinated to transport patients.

On March 4th, Shriners Chicago will be hosting a virtual Fourth Annual State of Research Symposium: Special Emphasis on Muscle and Bone Health. The goal of the meeting is to provide a forum for professional interaction and research collaboration among physicians, allied health professionals, engineers, and scientists that will facilitate improved care for our patients. It is expected that fifteen Shrine facilities will be represented, presenting on cuttingedge research in bone, muscle, and basic biology in children with cerebral palsy, spina bifida, osteogenesis imperfecta, foot deformity, scoliosis, gait abnormalities, and arthrogryposis.

Despite the COVID situation in Illinois, Shriners Children's Chicago is still performing surgeries and seeing patients at pre-COVID levels. Kudos to our staff.

The Development department at Shriners Children's Chicago closed out the year with donations totaling \$5.97 million, 155% of their goal. Thank you to all who donated to Shriners Children's and thank you to Dan Winter and his staff!



From the Desk of the Recorder -A call for applications On behalf of the Divan, I was asked to reach out and to notify our Nobles, that Shriners Children's - Twin Cities is accepting applications for representation as a Member of the Board of Governors. Shriners Children's - Ohio is accepting applications for Associate Member of the Board of Governors.

For Shriners Children's- Twin Cities, Board Member, the initial appointment will be for three years commencing on January 1, 2023 and expiring December 31, 2025. Nobles selected to fill the open positions will then be eligible for reappointment for up to two (2) additional three-year terms on the Board. Each nominee for membership on the Board of Governors must be a Noble in good standing in the Shrine, possess a high level of business or professional experience, and have a reputation for community leadership. He should be active, intelligent, and insightful in helping us provide high-quality service. This appointment should not be considered an award for service to the Shrine Temple. Since an investment in time and training is required to make an effective board member, potential nominees should expect to serve more than one term. In addition, the nominee should be advised that the board meets monthly, and he is expected to make every effort to attend all meetings without compensation and remuneration and that he must commit to becoming familiar with the Rules and Regulations of Shriners Hospitals for Children. Additionally, all board members must have regular access for sending and receiving e-mail.

For Shriners Children's - Ohio, Associate Members -Board of Governors each Divan may appoint an Associate member to the Board for a one-year term. This non-voting position is expected to meet all the other requirements for board participation.

Each nomination must include the following:

- · A fully completed Board of Governors Membership Data Form
- · A signed affidavit (attached) from the nominee indicating his understanding of the duties and responsibilities of Hospital Board Members and his willingness to become actively involved in the Board. • A letter of recommendation signed by the majority of current members of the elected Divan.
- Including a copy of your resume is suggested.

If you are interested in applying for either position, please contact me for the proper paperwork for completion. All applications and documentation must be received prior to April 1, 2022.
