Currently, all persons entering Shriners Children's Chicago must be fully vaccinated and boosted and wear a face mask while in the facility. Additionally, hospital van drivers/assistants must be fully vaccinated and boosted to transport patients. Any changes in this policy will be communicated in our weekly newsletter, the *eBugler*.

Chicago's COVID risk level is currently listed as LOW; however, masking is still required in healthcare facilities.

It is important to know that our Shrine healthcare system is financially healthy due to the Business/Finance strategies and our strong Donor Development team. Regionalization continues to be a focus within the Shrine system to promote efficiency and contain costs. A Physicians Group has been established based on four pillars: 1) Finance, 2) Quality, 3) Research, and 4) Academic development. This group will help achieve our strategic goals.

Shriners Children's Chicago is busy preparing two business plans to support an infusion center and a mobile MRI/CT scanner. Plans are to open a fourth operating room in the spring.

The State of the Science Research Meeting to be held at Georgia Tech this month will emphasize on Artificial Intelligence and Big Data. The meeting is an opportunity to increase collaboration among physicians and scientists representing each orthopedic Shrine facility. It is anticipated that 13 Shrine facilities will be represented. Shriners Children's Chicago's own Kyle Deane, Ph.D. will be presenting on his grant entitled Validation of the Pediatric Appraisals of Disability Primary and Secondary for Spinal Cord Injury.

Shriners Children's Chicago was the only Shriners Hospital to win all four PressGaney awards, Only one other Shrine hospital won two awards. Congratulations in particular to the inpatient unit for achieving the Pinnacle of Excellence Award which is recognition for the highest level standards for 3 years in a row!






