Greetings Nobles and Ladies,

If you are reading this before November's meeting, there is still time to contribute to the Parade to Glory.

This has been a difficult year financially and we need all the help we can get to move forward.

Not having a circus for two years has drained our Rainy Day Fund and at the same time the bills don't stop.

There are two major areas to contribute to this year.

First our Operations and/or Rainy Day Fund.

We use the Operations Fund to pay for day-to-day temple operations, when the Operations Fund is depleted, like it has been multiple times this year, we dip into our Rainy Day Fund. The last time we added any positive balance to the Rainy Day Fund in a year where we didn't take anything out of it was 2018, thanks in part to a great circus.

More and more we are dipping into this fund because we have no choice if we want to continue as an organization. Any donations to the Operations Fund will help us pay the bills this year, while any donations to the Rainy Day Fund will help us in the future. Both are greatly appreciated.

We also have a solution right in front of us that can greatly benefit those two funds. Right now we are selling tickets for a cash raffle with a grand prize of \$10,000 in cash with taxes already paid. Only 500 tickets will be sold at \$100 a piece. If we sell all 500 tickets, we can expect to make \$30,000 from the event, which would almost equal what we have taken out of the Rainy Day Fund this past year. Because these tickets are so expensive and limited, they need to be signed out with Ann. If you are having trouble selling tickets at such a high cost, try to get two, three or four people to go in on a purchase. At the bare minimum we need to sell 200 tickets to break even, anything after that is pure profit. So please consider signing a few out and helping with this year's largest fundraiser. If every Noble sold just two tickets, we would be beyond sold out and things will look much better financially for our incoming Potentate.

We also have a great new Lodge room addition where Masonic Lodges and the Rites can now meet, however, with the adding traffic, our parking lot is starting to really show its age. *Continued in next column* Ask anyone involved in municipal government or construction and they will gladly tell you the costs for these types of projects are only going to increase due to a general materials and labor shortage. With winter on the way, we don't want to see any Nobles or Ladies take a fall in the parking lot, which is riddled with potholes. This project will likely take some time to raise the funds, but it's needed now, and things will not get more affordable.



News from Shriners Hospital Chicago Shriners Hospitals for Children

We mourn the loss of our Chairman of the Board of Governors, Dean Larson of Orak Shriners, who passed away recently after a short illness.

As required by Shriners Hospital for Children®, all persons entering Shriners Chicago must be fully vaccinated. All persons who enter the building must wear a face mask.

Contractors will be replacing the flooring in the lobby, balcony, and clinic areas beginning this month. The carpeting/flooring in these areas are showing a lot of wear and tear due to the amount of traffic it receives and its age.

The Pediatric Orthotic and Prosthetic Services (POPS) continues to grow and has outgrown its current area(s). Plans are underway to relocate and expand the clinic area for the service.

A study is currently underway to provide 6-8 outpatient exam rooms for use primarily by non-Shrine providers to include pediatric cardio, pulmonary, dental, and general pediatrics. This is part of our strategic plan and will bring more potential patients to our facility.

The outpatient clinic at SHC-Chicago is seeing a steady average of seventy to eighty patients daily face-to-face and an additional 2-5 virtual visits. A push is on to encourage more telehealth visits, but our patients enjoy their visits to Shriners so much they want to come in person. SHC-Chicago is continuing to utilize three operating rooms per week with plans to open the fourth OR at least two days per week. Our surgeons are performing over one hundred surgeries monthly. The complexity of the surgeries produces a higher number of surgical minutes and that results in a higher hospital daily census. Also, the rehab outpatient volumes are almost equal the that of the outpatient clinic.

Several former patients of Shriners Hospitals for Children participated in the recent Paralympics held in Tokyo, Japan. Three former Chicago patients played together on the wheelchair basketball team. One of those players prepared a YouTube video about his experience.

Shriners Chicago has their own YouTube channel. If you need a video for a presentation, or just want to know more about the care we provide, visit Shriners Hospitals for Children — Chicago – YouTube.

The new hospital website, ShrinersChildrens.org is live. The website is mobile-friendly and allows users to request an appointment online. The site is full of information to assist parents in finding the right care for their children.
