Understanding Life Memberships

Shriners International has raised the Per Capita tax, increasing it by an additional \$20.00 per year, from the current \$30.00 to \$50.00. This change will take effect with the 2024 dues year. It is important to note that all members, except Total Life Members and Per Capita Life Members, will be assessed this tax.

If you have the means and would like to save on expenses, we encourage you to consider becoming a Life Member. Below, we have outlined the various Life Membership options available:

Life Hospital Assessment: For \$150.00 (thirty times \$5.00), you become a "Permanent Contributing Member" in the Shriners Hospital for Children Endowment Fund, making a lasting impact on the lives of children in need.

Life Per Capita Assessment: For \$900.00 (thirty times \$30.00), you become a "Per Capita Life Member," exempt from future per capita tax increases. Please note that this rate will increase to \$1,500 on January 1, 2024.

Life Temple Assessment: For \$980.00 (twenty times the current Beja dues of \$49.00), you become a "Temple Life Member." For individuals aged sixty-five and above the rate is ten times the current dues, \$490.00.

Bugler Assessment: For \$100 you will become a Bugler Life Member

Additionally, if you wish to obtain all four memberships, you can become a "Total Life Member" for \$2,130.00.

A Noble can become a Life Member in one or all these options at any time. Should you decide to pursue any of these Life Memberships, please contact Ann in the office as soon as possible, but before close of business on December 29, 2023.

Message From The Treasurer

With the increase in per capita by Imperial, you will notice that your dues will increase by \$20.00 per year. This increase of \$20.00 is forwarded directly to Imperial and does not stay here at Beia. The last increase in dues retained by Beja occurred in 2016 and since then, much has changed. The addition of the lodge room and library museum has been completed and the Blue Lodges have "moved in". With the addition of the lodges, some of our building expenses have been reduced and helped us balance the budget. That's the good news. With the building having been constructed in 1992, our building is now over 30 years old. Expected major capital repairs have begun and in 2023, the parking lot has been resurfaced and the roof replaced. These repairs along with other smaller replacements have cost approximately \$200,000.00 in 2023 alone. Other major replacements are expected over the next few years. In addition, our operating expenses have increased significantly just as yours have at home. Since the last dues increase, utilities, insurance & administrative expenses have increased anywhere between 20 & 35 percent.

At the September stated meeting, Potentate Sylvester initiated a town hall discussion allowing the Nobility to voice their thoughts on a dues increase that would remain at Beja. This was for discussion only and not to take action. It was encouraging to see a number of Nobles step up to express their opinions. One of those thoughts was a request for detailed financial information before asking the nobility to approve any dues increase. Over the next few months, the Divan will be creating a long-range financial plan to be shared with the Nobility at the stated meeting in December. During this process, I encourage the Nobility to express their opinions on this significant matter.

Because of the expenditure of 200,000.00 dollars for the parking Lot, roof, and other capital items in 2023, I would strongly encourage the clubs, units, and individuals to consider donating to the Capital Fund Account #1725.1 at this year's Parade to Glory.




