A BRIEF KRAZY KOP HISTORY

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All persons entering Shriners Children's Chicago must be fully vaccinated and wear a face mask while in the facility. While masking is not required in some areas of the city, there continues to be a mandate for masking in healthcare facilities. Additionally, hospital van drivers/assistants must be fully vaccinated to transport patients. Any changes in this policy will be communicated in our weekly newsletter, the eBugler.

The opening of a fourth operating room at Shriners Children's Chicago has been approved. This is a timely addition as SC-Chicago welcomes its newest spine surgeon. Other key positions to be filled are additional hospitalists to provide overnight coverage and a neurologist and an intensivist.

Traveler staff continues to be used, which enables SC-Chicago to keep our usual patient volumes. As newly hired staff becomes oriented agency usage will be decreased.

Productivity metrics for the Rehabilitation Services are noted as being the highest in the system. Chicago Rehab broke the 50% mark, while the system average is 36.25%.

COVID is still a concern in the Chicago area. There have been several instances of staff. patients, and guardians contracting COVID.




